1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state water

2 commission; to provide exemptions; to provide legislative intent; to create and enact a new-

3 section to chapter 61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the development of

4 policies and procedures of the state water commission; to amend and reenact sectionssection

5 6-09.5-03 and 54-35-02.37 of the North Dakota Century Code and sections 6 and 7 of

6 chapter 46 of the 2011 Session Laws, relating to the community water facility loan fund, the

7 water-related topics overview committee, and Fargo flood control project funding; to provide for

8 legislative management reports; to provide for a loan from the Bank of North Dakota; and to

9 declare an emergency.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:


SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state water commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state water commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

23	SECTION 3. SOVEREIGN LAND	S ENFORCEMENT (GRANT. The administ	trative and
24	support services line item in section 1	of this Act includes \$	135,000 from the res	ources trust
25	fund that the state water commission shall provide as a grant to the game and fish department			

26 for law enforcement activities on sovereign lands in the state, for the biennium beginning July 1,

- 27 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
- SECTION 4. ADDITIONAL INCOME APPROPRIATION. In addition to the amounts
 included in the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act, any additional amounts in the
 resources trust fund and water development trust fund that become available are appropriated,
 subject to budget section approval, to the state water commission for the purpose of defraying

3 SECTION 5. BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA LOAN - WESTERN AREA WATER SUPPLY 4 AUTHORITY. The Bank of North Dakota shall provide a loan of \$40,000,000 to the western 5 area water supply authority for construction of the project. The terms and conditions of the loan 6 must be negotiated by the western area water supply authority and the Bank of North Dakota 7 and any previous loans may be added to and merged into this loan as agreed by the authority 8 and the Bank of North Dakota. The authority may repay the loan from income from specific 9 project features. If the authority is in default in the payment of the principal of or interest on the 10 obligation to the Bank of North Dakota for the loan, the authority is subject to the default 11 provisions under section 61-40-09. 12 SECTION 6. GRANTS - WATER-RELATED PROJECTS - CARRYOVER AUTHORITY. 13 Section 54-44.1-11 does not apply to funding for grants or water-related projects included in the 14 water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of this Act. However, this exclusion is 15 only in effect for two years after June 30, 2015. Any unexpended funds appropriated from the 16 resources trust fund after that period has expired must be transferred to the resources trust fund 17 and any unexpended funds appropriated from the water development trust fund after that period 18 has expired must be transferred to the water development trust fund. 19 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 6 of chapter 46 of the 2011 Session Laws is amended 20 and reenacted as follows: 21 SECTION 7. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING - EXEMPTION. 22 Of the funds appropriated in the water and atmospheric resources line item in-23 section 1 of this Act, \$45,000,000 is for Fargo flood control projects, for the biennium 24 beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. Any funds not spent by June 30, 25 2011, are not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and must be continued into the next or-26 subsequent bienniums and may be expended only for Fargo flood control projects. 27 TheseExcept as otherwise provided, these funds may be used only for land purchases 28 and construction;, including right-of-way acquisition costs and may not be used for the-

- 29 purchase of dwellings or for a river diversion project. Notwithstanding any other
- 30 provision of law, including a political subdivision home rule charter, no public funds-
- 31 <u>may be used for the construction of ring dikes or water retention structures associated</u>

1	with the Fargo flood control project. No more than ten percent of these funds may not
2	be used for administration, engineering, legal, planning, or other similar purposes; and
3	are not subject to the sixty-five percent funding requirement contained in Senate Bill-
4	No. 2316 (2009). The city of Fargo, Cass County, and the Cass County joint water
5	resource district must approve any expenditures made under this section. Costs
6	incurred by nonstate entities for dwellings or other real property that are not paid by
7	state funds are eligible for application by the nonstate entity for cost-sharing with the
8	state.
9	- SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 7 of chapter 46 of the 2011 Session Laws is amended
10	and reenacted as follows:
11	SECTION 7. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING - EXEMPTION.
12	Of the funds appropriated in the water and atmospheric resources line item in
13	section 1 of this Act, \$30,000,000 is for Fargo flood control projects, for the biennium
14	beginning July-1, 2011, and ending June-30, 2013. Any funds not spent by June 30,
15	2013, are not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and must be continued into the next or
16	subsequent bienniums and may be expended only for Fargo flood control projects.
17	Except as otherwise provided, these funds may be used only for land purchases and
18	construction, including right-of-way acquisition costs and may not be used for the
19	purchase of dwellings or for a river diversion project. Notwithstanding any other
20	provision of law, including a political subdivision home rule charter, no public funds
21	may be used for the construction of ring dikes or water retention structures associated
22	with the Fargo flood control project. No more than ten percent of these funds may be
23	used for engineering, legal, planning, or other similar purposes. The city of Fargo,
24	Cass County, and the Cass County joint water resource district must approve any
25	expenditures made under this section. Costs incurred by nonstate entities for
26	dwellings or other real property that are not paid by state funds are eligible for
27	application by the nonstate entity for cost-sharing with the state.
28	SECTION 7. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING. Funds designated by the
29	sixty-first legislative assembly, the sixty-second legislative assembly, and the sixty-third
30	legislative assembly for Fargo flood control are available only for levee and dike protection until
31	the Fargo flood control project receives federal authorization, a project partnership agreement is

1	executed, a federal appropriation is provided for project construction, and the budget for the
2	Fargo flood control project is approved by the state water commission.
3	SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING. It
4	is the intent of the sixty-third legislative assembly that the state provide one-half of the local
5	cost-share of constructing a federally authorized Fargo flood control project and that total Fargo
6	flood control project funding to be provided by the state not exceed \$450,000,000.
7	SECTION 9. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING - EXEMPTION. Of the
8	funds appropriated in the water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of this Act,
9	\$100,000,000 is for Fargo flood control projects, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and
10	ending June 30, 2015. Any funds not spent by June 30, 2015, are not subject to section
11	54-44.1-11 and must be continued into the next or subsequent bienniums and may be
12	expended only for Fargo flood control projects, including levees and dikes. Except as otherwise
13	provided, these funds may be used only for land purchases and construction, including
14	right-of-way acquisition costs and may not be used for the purchase of dwellings-or for a river-
15	diversion project. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, including a political subdivision-
16	home rule charter, no public funds may be used for the construction of ring dikes or water-
17	retention structures associated with the Fargo flood control project. No more than ten percent of
18	these funds may be used for engineering, legal, planning, or other similar purposes. The city of
19	Fargo, Cass County, and the Cass County joint water resource district must approve any
20	expenditures made under this section. Costs incurred by nonstate entities for dwellings or other
21	real property which are not paid by state funds are eligible for application by the nonstate entity
22	for cost-sharing with the state.
23	
24	It is the intent of the sixty-third legislative assembly that total Fargo flood control project funding-
25	to be provided by the state not exceed \$325,000,000 to provide flood protection for the city of
26	Fargo to the forty-two and one-half foot level, and to provide, to the extent possible, flood-
27	protection for areas along the Red River north and south of Fargo. It is further the intent of the
28	legislative assembly that funds appropriated by the legislative assembly for Fargo flood control-
29	not be used for a river diversion flood control project.
30	SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - RED RIVER VALLEY WATER SUPPLY. Of the
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1 \$11,000,000 is for the Red River valley water supply project, for the biennium beginning July 1,

2 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BOND PAYMENTS. Of the funds appropriated in
 section 1 of this Act, \$60,000,000 in the water and atmospheric resources line item is from the
 resources trust fund for the purposes of paying off or defeasing outstanding bond issues. The
 state water commission may expend funds for this purpose only if available funding from the
 resources trust fund for water projects for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending
 June 30, 2015, has exceeded \$515,000,000\$287,000,000.

During the 2013-14 interim, the state water commission shall study the use of ring dikes as partof a flood protection plan for the city of Fargo. The study must include the effects of ring dikes inthe Fargo area on flood protection for areas north and south of Fargo. The state water-

13 commission shall provide periodic reports to the legislative management on the findings-

14 resulting from the study.

SUPPLY. During the 2013-14 interim, the state water commission shall study water supply
needs in the Red River valley, including projected costs of projects to meet water supply needsand the potential state commitment to supply water to the Red River valley. The state watercommission shall provide periodic reports to the legislative management on the findingsresulting from the study.

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SECTION 14. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY HARDWARE - TRANSFER TO SECURE
 DATA CENTER. The state water commission shall transfer all appropriate information

DATA CENTER. The state water commission shall transfer all appropriate information technology hardware to the information technology department secure data center during the
 biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

SECTION 15. STATE WATER COMMISSION PRIORITY PROJECTS LIST - REPORTS TO
 THE BUDGET SECTION. The state water commission shall report to the budget section any
 changes made to the state water commission priority projects list presented to the sixty-third
 legislative assembly within ninety days of the state water commission approving the change for
 the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

30 SECTION 12. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL - REPORTS TO THE BUDGET SECTION. The
 31 Fargo-Moorhead area diversion authority board shall report to the budget section prior to

1	December 2013 and prior to October 2014 regarding an update on congressional authorization
2	of the diversion project and the status of the self-insured crop insurance pool, mitigation efforts,
3	easements, and the project budget.
4	SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 6-09.5-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	amended and reenacted as follows:
6	6-09.5-03. Transfer of funds - Revolving fund.
7	A community water facility loan fund with an authorized ceiling of tentwenty-five million
8	dollars is hereby established from the future undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota or
9	other state funds. This is a revolving fund, and all moneys transferred into the fund, interest
10	upon fund moneys, and collections of interest and principal on fund loans must be used for the
11	purposes of this chapter.
12	SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-02.7 of the North Dakota Century Code is
13	amended and reenacted as follows:
14

1	- SECTION 18. A new section to chapter 61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
2	and enacted as follows:

4	<u>— The state water commission shall adopt policies regarding the development and financing</u>
5	of projects as follows:
6	<u>1. Municipal project funding and financing, including water treatment plants. The state</u>
7	water commission shall develop and adopt policies relating to the circumstances under
8	which a project qualifies for a grant and when the project qualifies for a loan.
9	<u> 2. Pipelines. The state water commission shall develop and adopt policies relating to:</u>
10	<u>— a. Pipeline expansion;</u>
11	<u> </u>

13	<u>d.</u> Ongoing maintenance cost of current and future projects.
14	<u> 3. Technology. The state water commission shall develop and adopt policies relating</u>
15	to the use of technology, including the use of technology for permitting and electronic
16	metering.
17	SECTION 14. EMERGENCY. The water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of
18	this Act and section 5 of this Act is are declared to be an emergency measure.
