1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the information

2 technology department; to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota

3 <u>Century Code, relating to information technology project planning; to amend and reenact</u>

4 sections 54-59-15 and 54-59-22 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to acceptance of

5 <u>funds and to agencies exempted from certain services of the information technology</u>

6 department; to authorize a relocation of information technology hardware; and to provide for

7 various transfers.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
10 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
11 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
12 other income, to the information technology department for the purpose of defraying the
13 expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015,

29 The 2013-15 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the

30 2015-17 biennium. The information technology department shall report to the appropriations

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- 1 committees of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the
- 2 biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

SECTION 3. TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director of the office of
 management and budget shall make transfers of funds between line items in section 1 of this
 Act for the information technology department as may be requested by the chief information
 officer as determined necessary for the development and implementation of information
 technology projects.
 SECTION 4. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION - STATEWIDE LONGITUDINAL
 DATA SYSTEM EXPENDITURES - APPROVAL. The department of public instruction may

10 spend only the federal funds for costs associated with the statewide longitudinal data system

11 upon approval of the expenditures by the information technology department, for the biennium

12 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

SECTION 5. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY HARDWARE RELOCATION TO SECURE

14 **DATA CENTER.** The attorney general, public service commission, and state water commission

15 shall relocate all appropriate information technology hardware to the information technology

16 department secure data center during the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending

17 June 30, 2015.

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18 SECTION 6. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
19 and enacted as follows:

- 20 Information technology project planning.
- 21 Each executive branch state agency, excluding entities under the control of the state board

22 of higher education, considering the development of an information technology project with an

23 estimated cost of one hundred thousand dollars or more shall involve the information

24 technology department in the planning and study of the project. A state agency must receive a

- 25 recommendation from the information technology department prior to proceeding with any study
- 26 relating to the project.
- 27 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 54-59-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- amended and reenacted as follows:
- 29 54-59-15. Acceptance of funds.
- 30 The department may accept federal or other funds, which must be deposited in the
- 31 information technology operating account or other accounts specified by the office of

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1	management and budget and which may be spent subject to legislative appropriation. The
2	department may apply for any public or private grants available for the improvement of
3	information technology.
4	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 54-59-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	amended and reenacted as follows:
6	54-59-22. Required use of electronic mail, file and print server administration,
7	database administration, application server, and hosting services.
8	Each state agency and institution, excluding the legislative and judicial branches, and the
9	institutions under the control of the state board of higher education, the public employees
10	retirement system, the retirement and investment office, the attorney general, and any entity-
11	exempted by the office of management and budget after advisement by the information
12	technology department, shall obtain electronic mail, file and print server administration,
13	database administration, storage, application server, and hosting services through a delivery
14	system established by the information technology department in conjunction with the office of
15	management and budget. The office of management and budget, after receiving advice from
16	the information technology department, shall establish policies and guidelines for the delivery of
17	services, including the transition from existing systems to functional consolidation, with
18	consideration given to the creation of efficiencies, cost-savings, and improved quality of service.
