6	SEC	CTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-19 Section 15.1-19-23 of the North Dakota	
7	Century Code is created and enacted as follows:		
8	Administration of medication 15.1-19-23. Medication program - Establishment -		
9	Opt-out - Liability - Immunity from liability.		
10	<u>1.</u>	A teacher or classified staff member who is not employed as a school nurse or	
11		physician to administer medication may choose to not administer medication under	
12		section 43-12.1-04. The board of a school district or the governing body of a nonpublic	
13		school may establish a program for providing medication to students that includes	
14		authorizing individuals to provide medication to a student if the individual has received	
15		education and training in medication administration and has received written consent	
16		of the student's parent or guardian.	
17	2.	A teacher or classified staff member, who is not employed as a licensed health care	
18		provider to provide medication, may choose to not provide medication under the	
19		program established under subsection 1.	
20	<u>2.3.</u>	An individual authorized to administer provide medication by section 43-12.1-04 under	
21		subsection 1, or a school district, the board of a school district, or the governing body	
22		of a nonpublic school that establishes a program for providing medication to students	
23		is not civilly or criminally liable for any act or omission of that individual when acting in

good faith while administering providing medication to a student, except when the
conduct amounts to gross negligence.
SECTION 2. A new subdivision to subsection 9 of section 43-12.1-04 of the North Dakota
Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
Within a primary or secondary school under a program established under section
15.1-19-23 if the individual has received education and training in medication
administration and has received written consent of the student's parent or
guardian.
