7	<u>1.</u>	A person engaged in the business of altering, repairing, constructing, or installing
8		septic systems must be certified by the department.
9	<u>2.</u>	The department shall administer and enforce a certification program for septic system
10		installers and has the following powers and duties:
11		a. To require training of and to examine septic system installers and their
12		employees;
13		b. To establish standards and procedures for certification of septic system installers:
14		c. To issue certificates to all applicants who satisfy the requirements for certification
15		under this section and any rules under this section, to renew certificates, and to
16		suspend or revoke certificates for cause after notice and opportunity for hearing;
17		d. To establish reasonable fees for certifying septic system installers; and
18		e. To adopt and enforce rules as necessary for implementation of this section.

20		septic systems without certification or in violation of such certification is guilty of a

APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general 15 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$357,645, or so much of the 16 sum as may be necessary, to the state department of health for the purpose of establishing 17 design standards for septic systems and regulating septic system installers, for the biennium
