7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:
8	SECTION 1. A new subsection to section 61-28-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	created and enacted as follows:
10	"Septage" means the liquid or solid material removed from septic systems, cesspools,
11	privies, chemical toilets, holding tanks, and similar devices that receive domestic
12	wastewater.
13	SECTION 2. A new subsection to section 61-28-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14	created and enacted as follows:
15	"Septic system" means a disposal system, and all of its components, used to receive,
16	treat, and dispose of domestic wastewater through microbiological decomposition and
17	soil absorption.
18	SECTION 3. A new subsection to section 61-28-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19	created and enacted as follows:
20	"Septic system servicer" means a person that engages in the business of servicing
21	septic systems, cesspools, privies, chemical toilets, holding tanks, and similar devices
22	that receive domestic wastewater.
23	SECTION 4. A new subsection to section 61-28-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
24	created and enacted as follows:

8	<u>1.</u>	A po	erson engaging in the business of servicing septic systems must have a permit		
9		issu	ued by the department and must comply with the conditions imposed by the permit.		
0	<u>2.</u>	The	e department shall administer and enforce a permitting program for septic system		
11		ser	vicers and has the following powers and duties:		
2		<u>a.</u>	To require training of and to examine septic system servicers and their		
3			employees;		
4		<u>b.</u>	To establish standards and procedures for permitting of septic system servicers;		
5		<u>C.</u>	To issue permits to all applicants who satisfy the requirements for certification		
6			under this section and any rules under this section, to renew permits, and to		
7			suspend or revoke permits for cause after notice and opportunity for hearing:		
8		<u>d.</u>	To establish reasonable fees for permitting septic system servicers;		
9		<u>e.</u>	To establish criteria for the sanitary management of septage, including standards		
20			for the transportation, treatment, and disposal of septage;		
21		<u>f.</u>	To require preapproval of land application sites;		
22		<u>g.</u>	To require recordkeeping and reporting;		
23		<u>h.</u>	To require spill reporting, corrective action, and evidence of financial

25		<u>i.</u>	To adopt and enforce rules as necessary for implementation of this section.		
26	<u>3.</u>	<u>In a</u>	dopting its rules the department shall apply different standards based on the size		
27		of the septic system servicer, on the type of the service provided, quantity of septage			
28		handled, and number of units. The department may not require preapproval of a land			
29	application site for an application from a rural single-family residence on property				
30		owr	ned or leased by the owner or lessee of the single-family residence.		

1 The department may inspect all septic system servicing activities, including records, 2 equipment, and disposal sites at all reasonable times to ensure compliance with the 3 laws of this state. Nothing in this section removes the duty of any person to comply 4 with applicable public health standards. 5 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 4 of section 61-28-08 of the North Dakota Century 6 Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 7 Any person who violates this chapter, or any permit condition, rule, order, limitation, or 8 other applicable requirement implementing this chapter, is subject to a civil penalty not 9 to exceed fivetwelve thousand five hundred dollars per day per violation. 10 **SECTION 7. REPEAL.** Chapter 23-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed. 11 **SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Act becomes effective January 1, 2014.
