A retiree who has accepted a retirement allowance from a participating political subdivision's retirement plan may elect to participate in the uniform group under this chapter without meeting minimum requirements at age sixty-five, when the employee's spouse reaches age sixty-five, upon the receipt of a benefit, when the political subdivision joins the uniform group insurance plan if the retiree was a member of the former plan, or when the spouse terminates employment. If a retiree or surviving spouse does not elect to participate at the times specified in this section, the retiree or surviving spouse must meet the minimum requirements established by the board. Each retiree or surviving spouse shall pay directly to the board the premiums in effect for the coverage then being provided. The board may require documentation that the retiree has accepted a retirement allowance from an eligible retirement plan other than the public employees retirement system."

The warden may be removed by the director of the division of adult services with the approval of the director of the department of corrections and rehabilitation for misconduct, neglect of duty, incompetency, or other proper cause showing an inability or refusal to properly perform the duties of the office. All other officers and employees must be appointed by the warden, subject to the approval of the director of the division of adult services. The warden shall show in the record of any officer or employee who is discharged by the warden the reason therefor director of the department of corrections and rehabilitation.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-23.3-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-23.3-05. Appointment and removal of officers.

The director of the department of corrections and rehabilitation with the approval of the governor may appoint a director of the division of juvenile services, a director of the division of adult services, and other division directors and personnel as deemed necessary for the effective and efficient operation of the department. The

director of the division of juvenile services, the director of the division of adult services, and other division directors who may be appointed shall meet qualifications as established for the classified service. The division directors may be removed by the director of the department, with the approval of the governor, for misconduct, neglect of duty, incompetency, or other cause showing an inability or refusal toproperly perform the duties of their office. All other officers and employees of each division must be appointed and removed by the director of the division, subject to the approval of the director of the department of corrections and rehabilitation.
