## Bismarck, January 9, 2013

The Senate convened at 12:30 p.m., with President Wrigley presiding.

The prayer was offered by Reverend Kari Bitz, Cord of Three Ministries, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senator Sorvaag.

A quorum was declared by the President.

### MOTION

**SEN. KLEIN MOVED** that the absent member be excused, which motion prevailed on a voice vote.

**SEN. KLEIN MOVED** that the Senate be on the Ninth order of business and at the conclusion of that order, the Senate stand in recess until 1:15 p.m., at which time it will meet in the House chamber for a Joint Session, and that the Senate will then stand adjourned until 12:30 p.m., Thursday, January 10, 2013, which motion prevailed on a voice vote.

# FIRST READING OF SENATE BILLS

Sens. Cook, Flakoll, Sorvaag and Reps. Kreun, Streyle, Trottier introduced:

**SB 2124:** A BILL for an Act to provide for the legislative management to study methods to assure that the legacy fund provides the lasting benefits intended by the voters in enacting the constitutional measure.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Sens. Axness, Lyson, Mathern and Reps. Maragos, Gruchalla, Hogan introduced:

**SB 2125:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 14-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the duty to report a missing child or the death of a child; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Sens. Cook, Campbell, Dotzenrod and Reps. Belter, Headland, Meier introduced:

**SB 2126:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 12.1-23-16 and a new subsection to section 57-39.2-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the prohibition of automated sales suppression devices; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

Sens. Sorvaag, Dever, Flakoll, Marcellais and Reps. Boehning, Kasper introduced:

**SB 2127:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 37-19.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to private employers providing a voluntary veterans' preference in employment.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sens. Klein, Wanzek and Reps. Dockter, Pollert, Oversen introduced:

**SB 2128:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 11-18-05, sections 24-01-25 and 35-22-19, and subsection 2 of section 35-24-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fees and notice requirements of the county recorder.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

Sens. Laffen, Cook, Sorvaag and Reps. N. Johnson, Kreun, Sukut introduced:

**SB 2129:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-21.3-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the state building code and accessibility standards.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Sens. Cook, Laffen, Sinner and Reps. Louser, Porter, M. Nelson introduced:

**SB 2130:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 47-16-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to notice of the termination of a lease.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Political Subdivisions Committee**.

Sens. J. Lee, Berry, Mathern and Reps. Hofstad, Weisz, Hogan introduced:

**SB 2131:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to genetic counseling; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Sen. Krebsbach and Reps. Frantsvog, Maragos introduced:

**SB 2132:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 6-09-46 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the rebuilders loan program; to provide an exemption; to provide for transfers; and to declare an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

Sens. Miller, Oehlke, Dotzenrod and Reps. Heilman, D. Johnson, Wall introduced:

**SB 2133:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 39-04-36 and 39-04-39.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to refunds for registration fees; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

Sens. Lyson, Armstrong, Oehlke and Reps. Hatlestad, Porter introduced:

**SB 2134:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 65-01-15.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to definition of law enforcement officers for workforce safety and insurance purposes.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

# FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Sens. Sitte, Wanzek, Warner and Reps. Heilman, Steiner, Muscha introduced: **SCR 4003:** A concurrent resolution recognizing School Choice Week. Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.
