Bismarck, January 10, 2013

The Senate convened at 12:30 p.m., with President Wrigley presiding.

The prayer was offered by Reverend Tim Johnson, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senator Sorvaag.

A quorum was declared by the President.

MOTION

SEN. KLEIN MOVED that the absent member be excused, which motion prevailed on a voice vote.

KLEIN MOVED that the Senate be on the Fifth and Ninth orders of business and at the conclusion of those orders, the Senate stand in recess until 1:15 p.m., at which time it will meet in the House chamber for a Joint Session, and that the Senate will then stand adjourned until 12:30 p.m., Friday, January 11, 2013, which motion prevailed on a voice vote.

FIRST READING OF SENATE BILLS

Sens. Dever, J. Lee, Axness and Reps. Porter, Rohr, Hogan introduced:

SB 2135: A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 43-17.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a physician health program.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Government and Veterans Affairs Committee**.

Sens. Krebsbach, Klein and Reps. Keiser, Porter introduced:

SB 2136: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 47-14-05 and 47-14-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to interest rates and late fees.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry, Business and Labor Committee**.

Sens. Lyson, Poolman and Reps. Hatlestad, Schatz, Sukut introduced:

SB 2137: A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 40-05.1-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to city sales tax revenue transfer to a school district for bonded indebtedness; to amend and reenact section 40-05.1-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to authorization of city sales tax imposition for payment of school district bonds for school building construction; to provide an effective date; and to provide an expiration date.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.

Sen. Holmberg introduced:

SB 2138: A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the highway patrol.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Appropriations Committee**.

Sens. Klein, Murphy, Robinson and Reps. Delzer, Monson, Vigesaa introduced:

SB 2139: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 49-22-04 of the North Dakota

Century Code, relating to the submission of ten-year plans by a utility.
Was read the first time and referred to the **Natural Resources Committee**.

Sens. Hogue, Lyson, Wardner and Reps. Klemin, Steiner, Vigesaa introduced:
SB 2140: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 32-09.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the service of the summons and notice of garnishment of earnings.
Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Hogue, Burckhard, Krebsbach and Reps. Klemin, Louser introduced:
SB 2141: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 12.1-32-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the supervision of probationers.
Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Cook, Oehlke, O'Connell and Reps. Drovdal, Nathe, Thoreson introduced:
SB 2142: A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new subsections to section 57-39.2-01 and a new section to chapter 57-39.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of telecommunications company and telecommunications services and a sales and use tax exemption for equipment used in telecommunications infrastructure development; to amend and reenact section 57-40.2-03.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to use tax exemption for telecommunications infrastructure purchased or installed by contractors; and to provide for an effective date.
Was read the first time and referred to the **Finance and Taxation Committee**.

Sens. Sinner, Campbell and Reps. Ruby, Vigesaa introduced:
SB 2143: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 21-06-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the investment of public funds.
Was read the first time and referred to the **Political Subdivisions Committee**.

Sens. Laffen, Grindberg, Klein and Reps. Porter, Zaiser introduced:
SB 2144: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 10-31 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to ownership of professional organizations; and to amend and reenact sections 10-31-01, 10-31-02, 10-31-02.1, 10-31-04, and 10-31-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to nonprofessional ownership of professional organizations.
Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry, Business and Labor Committee**.

Sens. Erbele, Lyson, O'Connell and Reps. Brabandt, Kretschmar, Maragos introduced:
SB 2145: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 62.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to carrying a firearm at a public gathering.
Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Krebsbach, Grindberg, Hogue, O'Connell and Reps. Belter, Kempenich introduced:
SB 2146: A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 4.1-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a grape and wine assessment; to amend and reenact sections 4-24-09 and 4-24-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to agricultural commodity assessment funds and reports; to provide a penalty; to provide an appropriation; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide a contingent effective date.
Was read the first time and referred to the **Agriculture Committee**.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Klein's motion.
