SECTION 3. A new subsection to section 57-39.2-23 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Upon request, the commissioner may furnish to the unclaimed property division of the board of university and school lands, a taxpayer's name, address, and federal identification number for identifying the owner of an unclaimed voucher authorized by the commissioner or to locate the

apparent owner of unclaimed property as provided under chapter 47-30.1."
