 - The individual is not participating in or directly interested in the labor dispute which caused the strike, sympathy strike, or a claimant's work stoppage dispute of any kind; and
 - b. The individual does not belong to a grade or class of workers of which, immediately before the commencement of the <u>stoppagelabor dispute</u>, there were members employed at the premises at which the <u>strike</u>, <u>sympathy strike</u>, <u>or a claimant's work stoppagelabor</u> dispute of any kind occurs, any of whom are participating in or directly interested in the <u>labor</u> dispute; provided, that if in any case separate branches of work, which are commonly conducted as separate businesses in separate premises, are conducted in separate departments of the same premises, each such department must, for the purpose of this subsection, be deemed to be a separate factory, establishment, or other premises.

SECTION 3. EMERGENCY. Section 2 of this Act is declared to be an emergency measure."
