 Was read the first time and referred to the Appropriations Committee.
- HB 1450: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsections 1 and 16 of section 62.1-01-01, sections 62.1-02-04 and 62.1-02-05, subdivision a of subsection 6 of section 62.1-02-13, section 62.1-03-01, and subsection 2 of section 62.1-04-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to concealed weapons and firearms.
 Was read the first time and referred to the Energy and Natural Resources Committee.

HCR 3041: A concurrent resolution to provide for a Legislative Management study consisting of a comprehensive review and analysis of the investment practices by the state and the State Investment Board.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.
