- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-02-13, 15.1-08-06, 15.1-14-04,
- 2 15.1-21-12, 15.1-21-19, and 15.1-27-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 3 provision of statutorily required school district data; and to repeal sections 15.1-06-18 and
- 4 15.1-09-35 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to school data reports.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-02-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 15.1-02-13. School district employee compensation report.

- BeforeOn or before September eleventhtenth of each year, each school district shall
 report the following information to the superintendent of public instruction, with respect
 to each teacher and class of teachers and with respect to each administrator and class
 of administrators:
- 13 a. The number of days each was employed during the preceding school year.
- b. The base salaries.
- 15 c. The amount of compensation provided for extended contracts.
- 16 d. The amount of compensation provided for cocurricular activities.
- 17 e. The amount expended for contract buyouts.
- 18 f. The amount of compensation provided in lieu of salaries.
- 19 g. The amount paid for signing bonuses.
- 20 h. The amount of compensation provided for substitute teaching and workload21 adjustment.
- i. The amount of compensation provided for any other purposes.
- 23 j. The amount expended for health insurance benefits.
- 24 k. The amount expended for dental, vision, and cancer insurance benefits.

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1		I.	The amount expended for life and long-term disability insurance benefits.
2		m.	The amount of retirement contributions and assessments, including individual
3			shares if paid by the district.
4		n.	The district's share of Federal Insurance Contributions Act taxes.
5		0.	The amount of dues or membership fees paid by the district.
6		p.	Any other benefits provided by the district.
7	2.	In a	ddition to the requirements of subsection 1, each school district shall also indicate:
8		a.	Whether each teacher and administrator is employed on a full-time or a part-time
9			basis.
10		b.	The number of days used to determine the base salary of each teacher and
11			administrator.
12	3.	The	e superintendent of public instruction shall:
13		a.	Compile the information required by this section in a manner that allows for
14			accurate comparisons; and
15		b.	Forward a copy of the compiled information to the governor and the legislative
16			council.
17	4.	The	e superintendent of public instruction may not expand the reporting requirements of
18		this	section.
19	5.	lf a	ny school district fails without good cause to provide the information required by
20		this	section on or before September tenth and in the manner directed by the
21		sup	erintendent of public instruction, the superintendent shall withhold all state aid until
22		the	information is received. On August twenty-seventh, the superintendent of public
23		<u>inst</u>	ruction shall provide to each school district superintendent electronic notification
24		rega	arding the date on which the employee compensation report required by this
25		<u>sec</u>	tion is due.
26	<u>6.</u>	<u>lf be</u>	ecause of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school district is unable
27		<u>to fi</u>	le the district's employee compensation report with the superintendent of public
28		<u>inst</u>	ruction before five p.m. on September tenth, the school district superintendent may
29		req	uest one extension from the superintendent of public instruction. The
30		<u>sup</u>	erintendent of public instruction shall grant the extension provided the request was

8	SEC	TION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
9	amende	d and reenacted as follows:			
10	15.1	-21-12. Professional development - Use of available funds.			
11	1.	On or before October first of each year, each school district shall file a report with the			
12		superintendent of public instruction indicatingwhich:			
13		a. The Indicates the amount and source of funds that were made available to the			
14		district for professional development during the preceding school year;			
15		b. The Indicates the amount and source of funds that were expended by the district			
16		for professional development during the preceding school year; and			
17		c. A separate Includes a list of the professional development activities in which the			
18		district participated during the preceding school year and the amount of time			
19		committed to the activities.			
20	2.	The superintendent of public instruction shall compile the information submitted under			
21		this section to determine how much of the available funding for professional			
22		development was used by school districts in this state and, beginning with the reports-			
23		due on or before October 1, 2002, whether the expenditure correlated with increased			
24		student achievement on the reading and mathematics tests required by section			
25		15.1-21-08.			
26	<u>3.</u>	On September seventeenth, the superintendent of public instruction shall provide to			
27		each school district superintendent electronic notification regarding the date on which			
28		the professional development report required by this section is due.			
29	<u>4.</u>	If because of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school district is unable			
30		to file the district's professional development report with the superintendent of public			
31		instruction before five p.m. on October first, the school district superintendent may			

1		request one extension from the superintendent of public instruction. The		
2		superintendent of public instruction shall grant the extension provided the request was		
3		received before five p.m. on October first. An extension under this section terminates		
4		at five p.m. on October fifteenth.		
5	<u>5.</u>	If an extension is not requested as provided for in subsection 4, or if the district's		
6		professional development report is not filed within the extended time period, as set		
7		forth in subsection 4, the superintendent of public instruction shall subtract from any		
8		state aid otherwise payable to the school district the prorated amount for each day		
9		beyond October first that the report is not on file with the superintendent of public		
10		instruction.		
11	SEC	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
12	amende	d and reenacted as follows:		
13	15.1	-21-19. Summative assessment - Selection - Cost - Exemptions.		
14	1.	Except as otherwise provided, each public and nonpublic school student in grade		
15		eleven shall take the ACT, including the writing test, or three WorkKeys assessments		
16		recommended by the department of career and technical education and approved by		
17		the superintendent of public instruction. The student shall determine which summative		
18		assessment to take. The superintendent of public instruction is responsible for the cost		
19		of procuring and administering one summative assessment per student.		
20	2.	The student's career advisor or guidance counselor shall meet with the student to		
21		review the student's assessment results.		
22	3.	A school district superintendent or a school administrator in the case of a nonpublic		
23		school student may exempt a student from the requirements of this section if taking		
24		the test is not required by the student's individualized education program plan or if		
25		other special circumstances exist.		
26	4.	At the time and in the manner determined by the superintendent of public instruction,		
27		each school district superintendent and each school administrator in the case of a		
28		nonpublic school shall report the number of eleventh grade students who:		
29		a. Took the ACT, including the writing test;		
30		b. Took the three WorkKeys assessments; and		

1		C.	Were exempted from the requirements of this section, together with the reason		
2			for each exemption.		
3	<u>5.</u>	Fourteen days before the date on which the information required by this section is to			
4		<u>be i</u>	reported, the superintendent of public instruction shall provide to each school		
5		<u>dist</u>	district superintendent and to the administrator of each nonpublic school electronic		
6		<u>noti</u>	fication regarding the date by which the information is due.		
7	<u>6.</u>	<u>a.</u>	If because of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school district is		
8			unable to report the required information to the superintendent of public		
9			instruction before five p.m. on the date by which the information is due, the		
10			school district superintendent may request one extension from the		
11			superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall		
12			grant the extension provided the request was received before five p.m. on the		
13			due date. An extension under this section terminates at five p.m. on the		
14			fourteenth day after the due date.		
15		<u>b.</u>	If because of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a nonpublic school		
16			is unable to report the required information to the superintendent of public		
17			instruction before five p.m. on the date by which the information is due, the		
18			administrator of the nonpublic school may request one extension from the		
19			superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall		
20			grant the extension provided the request was received before five p.m. on the		
21			due date. An extension under this section terminates at five p.m. on the		
22			fourteenth day after the due date.		
23	<u>7.</u>	<u>a.</u>	If an extension is not requested by a school district superintendent as provided		
24			for in subdivision a of subsection 6, or if the report is not filed within the extended		
25			time period, as set forth in subdivision a of subsection 6, the superintendent of		
26			public instruction shall subtract from any state aid otherwise payable to the		
27			school district the prorated amount for each day beyond the due date that the		
28			report is not on file with the superintendent of public instruction.		
29		<u>b.</u>	If an extension is not requested by the administrator of a nonpublic school as		
30			provided for in subdivision b of subsection 6, or if the report is not filed within the		
31			extended time period, as set forth in subdivision b of subsection 6, the		

1		<u>sup</u>	erintendent shall cause an audit to be conducted in order to obtain the		
2		<u>info</u>	rmation. All costs of the audit are the responsibility of the nonpublic school.		
3	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-27-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

1			payable to the school district the prorated amount for each day beyond the initial
2			due date that the report is not on file with the superintendent of public instruction.
3	2.	<u>a.</u>	On or before December fifteenth, each school district shall file with the
4			superintendent of public instruction the taxable valuation and mill levy
5			certifications. If a district fails to file the taxable valuation and mill levy
6			certifications by the required date, the superintendent of public instruction may
7			not forward to the district any state aid payments to which the district is entitled,
8			until the taxable valuation and mill levy certifications are filed.

10			school district superintendent electronic notification regarding the date on which
11			the taxable valuation and mill levy certifications required by this section are due.

14			superintendent of public instruction before five p.m. on December fifteenth, the
15			school district superintendent may request one extension from the
16			superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall
17			grant the extension provided the request was received before five p.m. on
18			December fifteenth. An extension under this section terminates at five p.m. on
19			December twenty-ninth.
20	<u>(</u>	<u>d.</u>	If an extension is not requested by the school district superintendent as provided
21			for in subdivision c or if the district's taxable valuation and mill levy certifications
22			are not filed within the extended time period, as set forth in subdivision c, the
23			superintendent of public instruction shall subtract from any state aid otherwise
24			payable to the school district the prorated amount for each day beyond
25			December fifteenth that the certifications are not on file with the superintendent of
26			public instruction.
