#### **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2032**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 17-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 2 to the western infrastructure strategy office; and to provide an appropriation.

### 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 17-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as

5 follows:

#### 6 <u>17-10-01. Western infrastructure strategy office.</u>

7 <u>The western infrastructure strategy office is governed by the department of commerce. The</u>

8 department of commerce shall appoint a director and the director may contract for services for

9 the completion of the director's duties within the limits of legislative appropriations.

## 10 <u>17-10-02. Duties of the western infrastructure strategy office.</u>

11 The director shall develop and maintain a current comprehensive strategic plan to identify

12 the current and future regional infrastructure needs of counties and communities affected by oil

13 and gas development through the collection and analysis of information and opinions of state

14 and local governmental entities and stakeholders involved in and affected by oil and gas

15 <u>development.</u>

## 16 <u>17-10-03. Duties of the director.</u>

17 <u>The director shall collect information from available resources and through studies directed</u>

18 by the department of commerce, as well as the North Dakota association of oil and gas

19 producing counties, analyze information from all available sources, and create a strategic plan

20 to address and prioritize the current and future impacts and infrastructure needs of the state

21 and counties and communities affected by oil and gas development. The director shall consult

22 and cooperate with state and local governmental entities, oil and gas industry representatives,

23 landowners, mineral owners, and other stakeholders involved in and affected by oil and gas

- 1 <u>development. For the plan, the director must include an analysis of all current funding,</u>
- 2 programs, and incentives used to address impacts and infrastructure needs.
- 3 <u>As directed by the department of commerce, the director shall analyze any changes or</u>
- 4 additions to funding, programs, and incentives to meet impacts and infrastructure needs. The
- 5 director shall make recommendations to the department of commerce to make the most efficient
- 6 <u>use of state and local resources to meet the current and future impacts and infrastructure needs</u>
- 7 of the state and counties and communities affected by oil and gas development. The director
- 8 may make recommendations for future areas of study and improved gathering of information
- 9 and, as requested, coordinate and direct state-funded studies relating to western infrastructure
- 10 and impacts. The director shall update the plan and recommendations based on changing
- 11 conditions.

# 12 <u>17-10-04. Reporting requirements.</u>

- 13 The director shall deliver a written report on the western infrastructure strategy office's
- 14 activities to the legislative council each biennium. The western infrastructure strategy office is
- 15 not subject to the requirements of chapter 54-60.1, but to ensure public accountability, the
- 16 director shall provide an annual report to the department of commerce detailing activities and
- 17 expenditures incurred during the preceding year. The director shall provide annual updates to
- 18 the budget section of the legislative management, the North Dakota association of oil and gas
- 19 producing counties, and the legislative management.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$300,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of establishing the western infrastructure strategy office, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
