1 A BILL for an Act to provide appropriations to the department of human services for improving

2 behavioral health services and for substance abuse treatment services; to provide for reports to

3 the legislative management; and to provide for legislative management studies.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - BEHAVIORAL

6 HEALTH ACTIVITIES FACILITATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general
7 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$100,000, or so much of the
8 sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of facilitating
9 the behavioral health activities required of the department of human services, for the biennium
10 beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.

11 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - REPORT TO 12 **THE LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general 13 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$750,000, or so much of the 14 sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of establishing 15 and administering a voucher system to address underserved areas and gaps in the state's 16 substance abuse treatment system, and to assist in the payment of addiction treatment services 17 provided by private licensed substance abuse treatment programs, for the period beginning 18 July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017. Services eligible for the voucher program include only 19 those levels of care recognized as effective by the American society of addiction medicine, with 20 particular emphasis given to underserved areas and programs focusing on youth services. The 21 department of human services shall ensure that a private licensed substance abuse treatment 22 program accepting vouchers under this Act collects and reports process and outcome 23 measures. The department of human services shall develop requirements and provide training 24 and technical assistance to a private licensed substance abuse treatment program accepting

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1	vouchers under this Act. A private licensed substance abuse treatment program accepting					
2	vouchers under this Act shall provide evidence-based services. Before July 1, 2016, the					
3	department of human services shall provide a report to the legislative management regarding					
4	the rules	the rules adopted to establish and administer the voucher system to assist in the payment of				
5	addiction treatment services provided by private licensed substance abuse treatment programs.					
6	SECTION 3. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES ANALYSIS - REPORT. During the					
7	2015-16 interim, the department of human services shall perform a cost-benefit analysis of the					
8	substance abuse treatment voucher system. The analysis must determine whether the program					
9	has allowed or will allow for cost savings in other department programs. The department of					
10	human services shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-fifth legislative					
11	assembly on the results of the cost-benefit analysis.					
12	SECTION 4. ADVISORY COMMITTEE - MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ISSUES -					
13	INCORPORATION IN TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAMS - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE					
14	MANAGEMENT.					
15	1.	Dur	ing the 2015-16 interim, the state board of higher education shall convene an			
16		adv	isory committee to address the desirability and feasibility of increasing the			
17		exp	osure of students enrolled in teacher preparation programs to the variety of mental			
18		and	behavioral health issues that the students are likely to encounter upon			
19		com	mencement of their professional teaching careers.			
20	2.	The	membership of the advisory committee must be determined by a majority of the			
21		follo	wing:			
22		a.	The commissioner of higher education;			
23		b.	The superintendent of public instruction;			
24		C.	The director of the department of human services;			
25		d.	The director of the state department of health;			
26		e.	A representative of the education standards and practices board;			
27		f.	A member of the house of representatives, appointed by the legislative			
28			management; and			
29		g.	A member of the senate, appointed by the legislative management.			
30	3.	The	membership of the advisory committee must be geographically balanced and			
31		inclu	ude:			

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1		a.	Representatives of public and private teacher education programs in the state;		
2		b.	Providers of behavioral health services to children under the age of eighteen;		
3		C.	Providers of mental health services to children under the age of eighteen;		
4		d.	Representatives of mental health advocacy organizations;		
5		e.	Representatives of the juvenile court;		
6		f.	Representatives of law enforcement; and		
7		g.	Representatives of Indian tribes in this state.		
8	4.	The	e committee shall meet as necessary to achieve the objective set forth in		
9		sub	section 1 and shall present a report before September 1, 2016, to a committee		
10		des	ignated by the legislative management.		
11	SEC	стю	N 5. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - ADULT MENTAL HEALTH		
12	ASSES	SME	NT NETWORK. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall		
13	consider studying mental health assessment networks for adults. The study must identify the				
14	populations that may benefit from an adult mental health assessment network, the challenges				
15	and any deficiencies that may exist, and alternative assessment delivery frameworks, and must				
16	provide details of how assessment networks may be integrated into the existing mental health				
17	delivery system. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations,				
18	together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth				
19	legislative assembly.				
20	SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NEEDS OF				
21	YOUTH	AND	ADULTS. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall consider		
22	studying behavioral health needs. The study must include consideration of behavioral health				
23	needs of youth and adults and access, availability, and delivery of services. The study must				
24	include input from stakeholders, including representatives of law enforcement, social and				
25	clinical service providers, education, medical providers, mental health advocacy organizations,				
26	emergency medical service providers, juvenile court, tribal government, and state and local				
27	agencies and institutions. The study must also address the development of a grant program for				
28	mental health first-aid training for teachers and nonlicensed school staff, the monitoring and				
29	reviewing of strategies to improve behavioral health services implemented pursuant to				
30	legislation enacted by the sixty-fourth legislative assembly and other behavioral health-related				
31	recomm	enda	ations presented to the 2013-14 interim human services committee. The legislative		

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- 1 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation
- 2 required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
