2	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 32-03-48 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
3	amended and reenacted as follows:		
4	32-03-48. Definitions.		
5	— As used in sections 32-03-48 through 32-03-50, unless the context otherwise requires:		
6	— 1. "Critical incident" means any event encountered by emergency service personnel		
7	within the scope of their employment which causes them to experience unusually-		
8	strong emotional reactions that have the potential to interfere with their ability to		
9	perform their jobs or that may interfere with their personal lives.		
10	2. "Critical incident stress debriefing" means the process of resolving the effects of		
11	critical incidents on emergency service personnel through a structured meeting with		
12	both psychological and educational components according to the model approved by		
13	the state department of health.		
14	3. "Critical incident stress management team" means those volunteers who are		
15	recognized by the state department of health as members of an organized group that		
16	provides critical incident stress debriefing services on behalf of the state.		
17	4. "Emergency service personnel" means individuals who provide emergency services to		
18	persons requiring medical aid, firefighting services, law enforcement assistance, or		
19	other emergency assistance. The term includes law enforcement officers, firefighters,		
20	rescue personnel, ambulance personnel, quick response personnel, emergency		
21	service dispatchers, nurses, physicians, and other emergency care providers.		
22	5. "Mental health personnel" means psychiatrists, licensed psychologists, licensed social		
23	workers, licensed mental health counselors, nurses, members of the clergy, licensed		
24	marriage and family therapists, and other individuals approved by the state		
25	department of health to function as members of a critical incident stress management		
26	team, who have completed appropriate training as approved by the department.		
27	6. "Peer support personnel" means those members of a critical incident stress		
28	management team who are emergency service personnel and who have completed		
29	appropriate training approved by the state department of health.		
30	SECTION 1. STATUTORY REFERENCES TO MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS -		
31	REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. During the 2015-16 interim, the department of		

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human services, in consultation with the state department of health and other stakeholders, shall study statutory references to mental health professionals to determine whether changes in the law may help to more fully utilize these professionals within their scope of practice, as it relates to the responsibilities of the department of human services to provide services or license facilities. In addition, the department of human services shall study statutory language and report recommended changes in alignment with the most current professional standard or with most current diagnostic and statistical manual. Before August 1, 2016, the department of human services shall report to the legislative management the outcome of the study together with any recommendations.
