## 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections <u>43-32-02</u>, 43-32-08, 43-32-12, 43-32-13, and

- 2 43-32-14, subsection 3 of section 43-32-16, and sections 43-32-17, 43-32-19.1, 43-32-20,
- 3 43-32-20.1, 43-32-21, 43-32-26, 43-32-27, 43-32-27.1, 43-32-30, and 43-32-34 of the North
- 4 Dakota Century Code, relating to the <u>membership</u>, powers, and duties of the state board of
- 5 psychologist examiners; to direct the state board of psychologist examiners to provide-
- 6 education; and to provide a penalty; and to provide an appropriation.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows: 10 43-32-02. State board of psychologist examiners - How appointed - Qualifications. 11 The governor shall appoint a state board of psychologist examiners consisting of fiveseven 12 members. At One board member must be designated a public member who is a resident of this. 13 state, is at least twenty-one years of age, and is not affiliated with any group or profession that 14 provides or regulates health care in any form. Of the remaining six board members, at least one 15 member must be engaged primarily in providing service in psychology, and at least one member 16 must be engaged primarily in teaching, training, or research in psychology. EachExcept the 17 public member, each member must: 18 1. Be a resident of this state. 19 2. Be a psychologist licensed under this chapter. 20 Have received a doctorate degree in psychology from a school or college at least five 3. 21 years before appointment. 22 4. Have actively engaged in the practice of teaching or research of psychology for at 23 least five years.

1	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	43-32-08. Rules.
4	The board may adopt rules as necessary to enable the board to carry into effect the
5	provisions of this chapter. The rules may include a code of ethics for licensees and registrants.
6	The board shall adopt rules defining what programs of study are substantially psychological in
7	nature; what educational programs are acceptable for the licensing of psychologists and applied
8	behavior analysts and for registering registered applied behavior analysts; and what educational
9	programs are acceptable for the licensing of industrial-organizational psychologists. The-
10	educational program rules for industrial-organizational psychologists must take into account the
11	availability of professionally accredited programs in the field of industrial-organizational
12	<del>psychology.</del>
13	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14	amended and reenacted as follows:
15	43-32-12. Application and fee for licensure and registration.
16	The board shall adopt rules establishing the amount of the application fee for licensure and
17	registration by written and oral examination and by reciprocity. A fee is not refundable, in whole
18	or in part, except for failure of the board to hold examinations at the time originally announced,
19	in which event the entire fee must be refunded upon demand by the applicant.
20	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
21	amended and reenacted as follows:
22	43-32-13. Annual license and registration fee.
23	Before January firstNovember fifteenth of each year, every licensee and registrant shall pay
24	to the secretary of the board an annual fee determined by the board not to exceed one hundred
25	fifty dollarsby rule. The secretary of the board, upon receipt of payment of the annual fee, shall
26	issue the licensee or registrant a certificate of annual renewal, which commences on January
27	first. An individual may not hold out as an industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied
28	behavior analyst, a registered applied behavior analyst, or a psychologist until the annual fee is
29	paid. The board may deny renewal of the license or registration of an individual who violates
30	this section. Annually, the board shall mail or electronically mail a renewal notice to each

31 licensee and registrant at the address <u>or electronic mail address</u> on file with the board.

1	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is

7	secretary of the board the amount of the annual fees in default and a late fee in the amount of-						
8	twenty dollarsestablished by the board by rule.

19	chapter, a person may not engage in the practice of industrial-organizational						
20	psychology unless that person is licensed as a psychologist or						
21	industrial-organizational psychologist or is registered as a psychology resident or						
22	industrial-organizational psychology resident under this chapter. Except as otherwise						
23	provided under this chapter, a person may not engage in the practice of applied						
24	behavior analysis unless that person is a psychologist, is licensed as an applied						
25	behavior analyst, or is registered and supervised as an applied behavior analyst as						
26	provided under this chapter.						
27	2. A person may not use the title "psychologist" or similar title unless that person is						
28	licensed as a psychologist. A person may not use the titles "industrial psychologist",						
29	"organizational psychologist", or "industrial-organizational psychologist" unless that						
30	person is licensed as a psychologist or industrial-organizational psychologist. <u>A person</u>						
31	may not use the title "applied behavior analyst" or similar title unless that person is						

1		licensed as an applied behavior analyst. A person may not use the title "registered			
2		applied behavioral analyst" or similar title unless that person is registered and			
3		supervised as a registered applied behavior analyst.			
4	3.	A person may not use the title "psychology resident" or similar title unless that person			
5		is registered as a psychology resident. A person may not use the titles "industrial			
6		psychology resident", "organizational psychology resident", or			
7		"industrial-organizational psychology resident" unless that person is registered as a			
8		psychology resident or industrial-organizational psychology resident.

2	This section applies to postdoctoral supervised employment in the practice of psychology
3	and industrial-organizational psychology. Supervision may only be performed by a psychologist
4	or industrial-organizational psychologist with Before starting supervised employment, a
5	psychologist with at least three years of post-license practice experience must be identified as
6	the primary supervisor. The primary supervisor must have a competency in supervision in
7	professional psychology in the general area of practice being supervised.
8	Supervision must include at least two hours of regularly scheduled direct supervision a
9	week for full-time employment, one hour of which must be with the supervisor on a one-to-one-
10	basisoccur weekly and consist of at least one hundred hours of direct supervision, either
11	face-to-face or through distance communications. The remaining hour At least fifty of the hours
12	of supervision must be with the primary supervisor. Additional hours of supervision may be with
13	other professionals designated by the supervisor and competent in the area of practice being
14	supervised. The board may adopt rules to prorate the two hours per week of supervision for
15	individuals preparing for licensure on a part-time basis.
16	The board may adopt rules regarding postdoctoral psychology and industrial-organizational
17	psychology supervision requirements and reporting.
18	SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19	amended and reenacted as follows:
20	43-32-21. Consideration of application and notice to applicant.
21	Upon investigation of the application and other evidence submitted, the board, not less than-
22	thirty days before the examination, shall notify each applicant that the application and evidence
23	submitted for licensing is satisfactory and accepted, or unsatisfactory and rejected. If rejected,
24	the notice must state the reasons for rejection and explain the right to a hearing under chapter
25	28-32, if a hearing is requested within thirty days.
26	SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-26 of the North Dakota Century Code is
27	amended and reenacted as follows:
28	43-32-26. Issuance and display of license.
29	The board is the sole agency empowered to examine competence in the practice of
30	psychology. A license certificate of license or registration issued by the board must show the full
31	name of the licensee, have a serial number, be signed by the president of the board, and be

1	attested by the secretary under the board's adopted seal. The license issued by the board				
2	under this chapter must be prominently displayed at the principal place of business at which the				
3	licensee practices.

25		the licensee. The board may establish procedural exceptions for processing multiple				
26		complaintsallegations from the same complainantperson.

28		the information in an allegation warrants investigation as a complaint, without requiring				
29		the identity of the complainantsource of the information to be made a matter of public

- A licensee, registrant, or psychology resident who is the subject of an investigation by
   the board shall cooperate fully with the investigation. Cooperation includes responding
   fully and promptly to any reasonable question raised by or on behalf of the board
   relating to the subject of the investigation and providing copies of patient or client
   records if reasonably requested by the board and accompanied by the appropriate
   release.
- 7 4. In order to pursue an investigation, the board may subpoena and examine witnesses 8 and records, including patient and client records, and may copy, photograph, or take 9 samples of the records. The board may require the licensee, registrant, or psychology 10 resident to give statements under oath, to submit to a physical or psychological 11 examination, or both, by a physician or other gualified evaluation professional selected 12 by the board, if requiring an examination is in the best interest of the public. The 13 patient and client records released to the board are not public records. The board may 14 adopt rules to assign, define duties, and compensate an investigator to assist the 15 board to process a complaint.
- 5. Unless a patient or client release is on file allowing the release of information at the
  public hearing, patient and client records acquired by the board in the board's
  investigation are confidential and closed to the public. All board meetings at which
  patient or client testimony or records are taken or reviewed are confidential and closed
  to the public. If patient or client testimony or records are not taken or reviewed, the
  remainder of the meeting is an open meeting unless a specific exemption is otherwise
  applicable.

SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 25 **43-32-30.** Persons exempt from this chapter.
- 26 This chapter does not apply to:
- A student or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology, industrial-organizational
   psychology, or applied behavior analysis at a school or college, if the activities and
   services are a part of the individual's supervised course of study and are under the
   supervision of a licensed psychologist, industrial-organizational psychologist, or
   applied behavior analyst. The student or intern may not use the title "psychologist",

- "industrial-organizational psychologist", "licensed behavior analyst", or "registered
   applied behavior analyst" and the. The student or intern status and the supervisor
   must be clearly stated.
- A nonresident licensed, registered, or certified in the state of the individual's residence who does not practice psychology, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied
   behavior analysis in this state for a period of more than thirty days in any calendar <del>year.</del>
- A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title when
   lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not engage in the
   practice of psychology, applied behavior analysis, or industrial-organizational
   psychology unless the lecturer is licensed or registered under this chapter.
- 4.3. An individual employed by a public school if that individual's activities and services are
  restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of employment.
  This exemption applies only if the individual has received a master's degree in school
  psychology from an accredited graduate training program. Standards must be
  established by mutual consent of the board and the superintendent of public
  instruction.
- 5.4. A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care
   profession, or as a member of the clergy functioning in a ministerial capacity, whose
   scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of that person's
   profession. A person claiming an exemption under this subsection may not represent
   to be rendering psychological or applied behavior analysis services.
- An applicant licensed to practice psychology or industrial-organizational psychology in
  another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application in this state, if
  the applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of the applicant's
  intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the applicant adheres to
  the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the board.
- 7.6. A person employed by an agency, a nonprofit corporation, or an institution if that
   person is currently exempt from licensure. A person exempt under this subsection
   continues to be exempt if the person continues employment in the same position with

- the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution that applied for and received the
   exemption.
- 8.7. An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual in a public
  school setting.
- 9.8. An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual served by a
  public or private service agency licensed by the state to provide residential,
  habilitative, vocational, or social support services as defined by the board when
  performed as part of an individual support plan supervised by a professional employee
  meeting the requirements of that agency's licensure standards, provided the
- professional employee does not represent to the public as a registrant or an, applied
  behavior analyst, or psychologist.
- 12 10.9. An individual who is implementing applied behavior analysis services to an immediate
   13 family member or as a paid or volunteer caregiver implementing procedures
   14 established by the family or by the individual served in any setting, if the individual or
   15 caregiver does not represent as a registrant or an applied behavior analyst.

4	the 2015-17 biennium, the state board of psychologist examiners shall provide in-state,
5	comprehensive training for state agencies and boards regarding current regulator best practices
6	relating to professions regulated by the state.
7	SECTION 18. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general
8	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$20,000, or so much of the
9	sum as may be necessary, to the state board of psychologist examiners for the purpose of
10	providing training as directed under section 16 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1,
11	2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
