- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21, relating to the
- 2 demonstration of proficiency in civics as a condition of high school graduation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

5 and enacted as follows:

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6 High school graduation requirement - Civics test.

- 7 <u>1.</u> For purposes of this section, "civics test" means the one hundred questions that, as of
- 8 January 1, 2015, officers of the United States citizenship and immigration services use
- 9 as the basis for selecting the questions posed to applicants for naturalization, in order
- 10 that the applicants can demonstrate a knowledge and understanding of the
- 11 <u>fundamentals of United States history and the principles and form of United States</u>
- 12 government, as required by 8 U.S.C. 1423.
- Before a student may be awarded a high school diploma, the student must correctly
 answer at least sixty percent of the questions on the civics test.
- 15 <u>a.</u> <u>This requirement applies to each student:</u>
 - (1) Enrolled in a public school district;
 - (2) Enrolled in a nonpublic school;
 - (3) Enrolled in the center for distance education;
 - (4) Receiving home education; or
 - (5) Pursuing a general equivalency diploma.
- 21 b. This requirement does not apply to a student who is exempted in accordance
 22 with the student's individualized education program plan.

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1	<u>3.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall, upon request, provide to the person
2		administering the civics test the correct answer or acceptable answers to each
3		question.
4	<u>4.</u>	Each student must be provided with an opportunity to take the civics test at least one
5		time per school calendar. A student may take the test at any time after enrolling in
6		grade seven and may repeat the test as often as necessary to demonstrate
7		proficiency.
8	<u>5.</u>	Neither the superintendent of public instruction nor a school district may impose or
9		collect any fees or charges in connection with this section.
10	<u>6.</u>	This section is applicable to any student who graduates from high school during or
11		after the 2016-17 school year.
