4	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 51-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created				
5	and enacted as follows:				
6	Warranty work compensation - Outdoor power equipment.

8		<u>a.</u>	"Manufacturer" means a person that manufactures or assembles outdoor power		
9			equipment, sells outdoor power equipment directly or through a distributor to a		
10			retailer of outdoor power equipment, and provides a warranty.		
11		<u>b.</u>	"Outdoor power equipment" includes light industrial power lawn and garden		
12			equipment, hand-held power lawn and garden equipment, and power snow		
13			removal equipment and includes small engines and other power sources that		
14			operate such equipment.		
15		<u>C.</u>	"Retailer" means a business that purchases outdoor power equipment for resale		
16	<u>2.</u>	<u>lf a</u>	manufacturer authorizes a retailer to perform warranty work on outdoor power

1	<u>C.</u>	Reimbursement by the manufacturer for parts used in the performance of
2		warranty repair may not be less than the amount paid by the retailer to acquire

4		thirtytwenty percent of the amount paid by the retailer to acquire the parts.
