- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for a shelter and assessment pilot project for at-risk youth; to
- 2 provide an appropriation; and to provide for a report to the legislative management.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4	SECTION 1. SHORT-TERM RESIDENTIAL JUVENILE ASSESSMENT CENTER - PILOT
5	PROJECT. The department of human services shall establish a pilot project with a multibed
6	facility in the lake region human service region for the purpose of providing short-term shelter,
7	assessment and intervention services, respite care, and community-based treatment for at-risk
8	youth for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The project must
9	allow for the placement of at-risk youth in a short-term, nonsecure shelter and provide
10	professional assessment, treatment, and family reunification services. The department of
11	human services may contract with a nonprofit organization to provide for the pilot project.
12	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES. There is
13	appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise
14	appropriated, the sum of \$750,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the
15	department of human services for the purpose of establishing a short-term residential juvenile
16	assessment center pilot project, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30,
17	2017. The department of human services shall implement the pilot project in conjunction with
18	the implementation of the mental health assessment network, if approved by the sixty-fourth
19	legislative assembly as provided for in Senate Bill No. 2048.
20	SECTION 3. REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. The department of human
21	services shall provide a report to the legislative management regarding the short-term
22	residential shelter, assessment, referral, and intervention project by July 1, 2016.
