- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-06-01, 15.1-22-02, 15.1-32-01,
- 2 15.1-34-01, and 15.1-37-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the age of admission
- 3 to schools.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-06-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-06-01. Schools free and accessible School ages.
- 8 1. Each public school must be free, open, and accessible at all times to any child provided:
 - a. The child may not enroll in grade one unless the child reaches the age of six before August first of the year of enrollmentthe first day of the school calendar in the child's district of enrollment;
 - b. The child may not enroll in kindergarten unless the child reaches the age of five before August first of the year of enrollmentthe first day of the school calendar in the child's district of enrollment; and
 - c. The child has not reached the age of twenty-one before August first of the year of enrollment the first day of the school calendar in the child's district of enrollment.
 - Notwithstanding subsection 1, a school district may not enroll in grade one a child who
 is not six years old before August firstthe first day of the school calendar in the child's
 district of enrollment, unless the child will be six years old before December first and:
 - The child, by means of developmental and readiness screening instruments approved by the superintendent of public instruction and administered by the school district, can demonstrate academic, social, and emotional readiness; or
 - b. The child has completed an approved kindergarten program.

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- 3. Notwithstanding subsection 1, a school district may not enroll in kindergarten a child who is not five years old before August first day of the school calendar in the child's district of enrollment unless the child will be five years old before December first and the child, by means of developmental and readiness screening instruments approved by the superintendent of public instruction and administered by the school district, can demonstrate superior academic talents or abilities and social and emotional readiness.
 - 4. The requirements of this section are not applicable to the children of military families, to the extent that the requirements conflict with enrollment provisions otherwise agreed to by the state in the compact on educational opportunity for military children.
- 11 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-22-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 13 **15.1-22-02. Public kindergarten Requirements.**
- 14 A school district operating a kindergarten:
 - May not employ an individual as a kindergarten teacher unless the individual is
 licensed to teach by the education standards and practices board or approved by the
 education standards and practices board;
- Shall submit to the superintendent of public instruction and follow a developmentally
 appropriate curriculum;
 - 3. Shall provide kindergarten instruction, on a half-day or full-day basis, as determined by the school board;
- 22 4. Shall provide for a kindergarten instructional calendar equal to at least fifty percent of 23 the full-time instructional days required in accordance with section 15.1-06-04;
- 5. Shall apply all municipal and state health, fire, and safety requirements to the kindergarten; and
- 6. May not enroll a child who is not five years old before August first of the year of enrollment the first day of the school calendar in the child's district of enrollment, unless the child will be five years old before December first and:
 - a. The child, by means of developmental and readiness screening instruments approved by the superintendent of public instruction and administered by the

4	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9		supportive services required to assist a student with disabilities to benefit from special

11	2.	"Special education" means instruction designed to meet the needs of a student with				
2		disabilities, transportation, and corrective and supporting services required to assist a				
3		student with disabilities in taking advantage of, or responding to, educational programs				
4		and opportunities.				
5	3.	"Student who is gifted" means an individual who is identified by qualified professionals				
6		as being capable of high performance and who needs educational programs and				
7		services beyond those normally provided in a regular education program.				
8	4.	a. "Student with a disability" means an individual who is at least three years of age				
9		but who has not reached the age of twenty-one before September first of the year				
20		in which the individual turns twenty-one the first day of the school calendar in the				
21		student's district of enrollment and who requires special education and related				
22		services because of:				
23		(1) An intellectual disability;				
24		(2) A hearing impairment, including deafness;				
25		(3) Deaf-blindness;				
26		(4) A speech or language impairment;				
27		(5) A visual impairment, including blindness;				
28		(6) An emotional disturbance;				
29		(7) An orthopedic impairment;				
30		(8) Autism;

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- 1 (10) Other health impairment; or
 - (11) A specific learning disability.
 - b. "Student with a disability" includes a student age eighteen through twenty-one who is incarcerated in an adult correctional facility and who, in the last educational placement prior to incarceration, was identified as being a student with a disability and did not have an individualized education program or was identified as being a student with a disability and had an individualized education program.
 - **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-34-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

11 15.1-34-01. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

- "Boarding home care for a student with disabilities" means the provision of food, shelter, security, and safety, on a twenty-four-hour basis, to an individual who has reached the age of three years but who has not reached the age of twenty-one before September first of the year in which the individual turns twenty-onethe first day of the school calendar in the child's district of enrollment and who because of mental, physical, emotional, or learning characteristics requires regular or special education and related services designed to meet the individual's educational needs.
- 2. "Department" means the department of human services.
- 3. "Family boarding home" means a private residence at which boarding home care is 22 regularly provided by the owner or lessee to no more than four students with 23 disabilities. The limit of four students may be exceeded if all the students boarding at 24 the home are related to each other by blood or marriage.
 - 4. "Registration" means the process by which the department maintains a record of all family boarding homes, prescribes standards and adopts rules under section 15.1-34-14, and requires the operator of a home to certify that the operator has complied with the prescribed standards and adopted rules.
 - 5. "Registration certificate" means a document issued by the department to provide public notice that the certificate holder is in compliance with this chapter and the applicable rules and standards prescribed by the department.

7		requ	uest approval of the program from the superintendent of public instruction. The	
8		sup	erintendent shall approve an early childhood education program if the program:	
9		a.	Is taught by individuals who are licensed to teach in early childhood education by	
10			the education standards and practices board;	
11		b.	Follows a developmentally appropriate curriculum;	
12		C.	Is in compliance with all municipal and state health, fire, and safety requirements

14		d.	Limits its enrollment to children who have reached the age of four before August	
15			first in the yearthe first day of the school calendar in the child's district of	
16			enrollment.	
17	2.	In d	etermining the state aid payments to which a school district is entitled, the	
18	superintendent of public instruction may not count any student enrolled in a regular
