- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 15.1-02.1, a new section to chapter 15.1-19, and
- 2 three new sections to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to restrictions
- 3 on the collection and dissemination of student information; and to provide a penalty.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 15.1-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>15.1-02.1-01. Student information Collection by state agency Limitation.</u>
- 8 <u>1.</u> A state agency may not collect any information about a student other than the
- 9 following:
- 10 a. The student's name:
- 11 <u>b.</u> The student's age;
- 12 <u>c.</u> <u>The student's gender;</u>
- 13 <u>d.</u> <u>The student's race;</u>
- 14 <u>e. The student's grade level;</u>
- 15 <u>f. The student's school and school district of enrollment;</u>
- 16 <u>g. The student's state assessment scores;</u>
- 17 <u>h. Courses or units the student has completed, together with the grades obtained;</u>
- i. The student's dates of enrollment;
- 19 <u>j. The student's unique identification number, as used in PowerSchool; and</u>
- 20 <u>k.</u> A list of federal programs in which the student participates.
- 2. A state agency may not, by means of a data sharing contract, expand the list of
- 22 <u>permitted information set forth in this section.</u>

23	provided with an opportunity to prohibit their child's participation in the program. A student age				
24	eighteen or older may refuse to accept such a device.

- 5 4. Monitors or tracks the student's location.
- 6 **SECTION 5.** A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows:
- 8 Assessment questions Survey items Limitations.
- Any assessment required by this state or by a school district may not include any questions
- 10 <u>or survey items, whether mandatory or optional, that seek information pertaining to:</u>
- 11 <u>1. The political beliefs of the student, the student's parent, or a family member;</u>
- 12 <u>2. Mental or psychological conditions of the student, the student's parent, or a family</u>
- 13 <u>member</u>;
- 14 3. The sexual behavior of or attitudes regarding sexual behavior held by the student, the
- 15 <u>student's parent, or a family member;</u>
- 16 <u>4. Illegal, antisocial, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior engaged in by the student,</u>
- 17 <u>the student's parent, or a family member;</u>
- 18 <u>5.</u> <u>Critical appraisals of individuals with whom the student has a familial or close</u>
- 19 <u>relationship;</u>
- 20 <u>6. Legally recognized privileged relationships:</u>
- 21 <u>7.</u> Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student, the student's parent, or a
- 22 family member;
- 23 8. Gun ownership by the student, the student's parent, or a family member;
- 24 9. Income of the student, the student's parent, or a family member; or
- 25 <u>10.</u> Any other matter not directly related to the content of the assessment, as identified in
- 26 <u>state or school district standards.</u>
