1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision a of subsection 4 of section 15.1-32-01,

2 sections 50-06.4-01, 50-06.4-02, 50-06.4-04, 50-06.4-05, 50-06.4-06, 50-06.4-07, 50-06.4-08,

3 50-06.4-09, 50-24.1-33, and 54-38-05, and subsection 25 of section 65-01-02 of the North

4 Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of brain injury; and to provide an appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision a of subsection 4 of section 15.1-32-01 of the
7 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

a.	"Student with a disability" means an individual who is at least three years of age
	but who has not reached the age of twenty-one before September first of the year
	in which the individual turns twenty-one and who requires special education and
	related services because of:
	a.

(1) An intellectual disability;

(2) A hearing impairment, including deafness;

- 14 (3) Deaf-blindness;
- 15 (4) A speech or language impairment;
- 16 (5) A visual impairment, including blindness;
- 17 (6) An emotional disturbance;
- 18 (7) An orthopedic impairment;
- 19 (8) Autism;

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- 20 (9) A traumatic brain injury;
 - (10) Other health impairment; or
- 22 (11) A specific learning disability.

23 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06.4-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

24 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 **50-06.4-01**. Definitions.

2 As used in this chapter:

- "Brain injury" means any injury to the brain which occurs after birth, but before age
 sixty-five, which is acquired through traumatic or nontraumatic insults. Nontraumatic
 insults include anoxia, aneurysm, and encephalopathy. The term does not include
 hereditary, congenital, or degenerative brain disorders or injuries induced by birth
 trauma.
- 8 <u>2.</u> "Department" means the department of human services.
- 9 2. "Traumatic brain injury" means an acquired injury to the brain caused by an external
- 10 physical force resulting in total or partial disability or impairment, including open and
- 11 closed head injuries that may result in mild, moderate, or severe impairments in one or-
- 12 more areas including cognition, language, memory, attention, reasoning, abstract-
- 13 thinking, judgment, problem-solving, sensory perceptual and motor abilities,
- 14 psychosocial behavior, physical functioning, information processing, and speech. The
- 15 term does not include brain injuries that are congenital or degenerative or brain-
- 16 injuries induced by birth trauma, but may include brain injuries caused by anoxia and
 17 other related causes.
- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06.4-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 50-06.4-02. Department to be lead agency Cooperation of other agencies Joint
 meeting.
- 22 The department shall act as lead agency in the state for the purpose of coordinating 23 services to personsindividuals with traumatic brain injury. At least annually the department shall 24 call a joint meeting of the adjutant general, the state department of health, the department of 25 veterans' affairs, and the superintendent of public instruction to discuss the provision of services 26 to individuals with traumatic brain injury. State agencies and political subdivision agencies shall 27 cooperate with the department to permit the department to efficiently coordinate services to 28 persons individuals with traumatic brain injury while avoiding duplication of services. Neither this 29 chapter, nor any activity undertaken by the department under this chapter, may be construed as 30 creating a right to any benefit or service not specifically required to be granted as a condition of 31 the receipt of grants of federal funds.

3	50-06.4-04. Authority to accept and expend grants, gifts, and services.					
4	The department may apply for and accept any funds, grants, gifts, or services made					
5	available	available for the purpose of providing or coordinating services to personsindividuals with				
6	traumati	traumatic brain injury by any federal agency or department or any private agency or individual.				
7	Funds re	Funds received by the department under this section must be deposited in the state treasury in				
8	a special fund designated as the traumatic brain injury fund and may be spent within the limits					
9	of legislative appropriation.					
10	SEC	CTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06.4-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
11	amende	d and reenacted as follows:				
12	50-06.4-05. Traumatic brainBrain injury - Prevention and identification activities.					
13	The department shall provide outreach services and conduct public awareness efforts					
14	regarding the prevention and identification of traumatic brain injury.					
15	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06.4-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
16	amended and reenacted as follows:					
17	50-06.4-06. Traumatic brain<u>Brain</u> injury - Services and activities - Acceptance of					
18	moneys).				
19	The department may accept and expend moneys from any public or private source,					
20	including federal sources, for any purpose involving traumatic brain injuries or the provision of					
21	services	to individuals with traumatic brain injury and their families.				
22	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06.4-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
23	amende	d and reenacted as follows:				
24	50-0	06.4-07. Traumatic brainBrain injury - Informal supports - Contracts - Exemption.				
25	1.	The department shall contract with public or private entities for the provision of				
26		informal supports to individuals with traumatic brain injury. As used in this section,				
27		"informal supports" includes information sharing and referral services, peer mentoring,				
28		training, facilitation of support groups, public awareness efforts, and individual and				
29		programmatic advocacy efforts.				
30	2.	Any entity contracting with the department under this section must:				

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- 1a.Demonstrate expertise in serving and enhancing the quality of life for individuals2with traumatic brain injury;
- b. Agree to work in cooperation with the department, case managers, and veterans'
 service officers; and
- 5 c. Agree to consult with veterans and other individuals having a traumatic brain
 6 injury, their families, and their caregivers.
- 7 3. The department is exempt from complying with chapter 54-44.4 with respect to
 8 contracting for the provision of informal supports under this section.

9 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06.4-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 10 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 11 **50-06.4-08. Social and recreational services.**
- 12 The department shall provide or contract for the provision of social and recreational
- 13 services, including day supports, to individuals with traumatic brain injury, if the department

14 determines that available vocational rehabilitative services do not meet the individuals' needs.

15 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06.4-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is

16 amended and reenacted as follows:

17 **50-06.4-09**. Vocational rehabilitation and consultation.

The department shall provide or contract for the provision of increased and specialized vocational rehabilitation and consultation to individuals with traumatic brain injury who receive case management for personal care services. Services under this section include extended support for individuals at risk of losing their employment upon exhausting their vocational services.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 50-24.1-33 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

50-24.1-33. Traumatic brainBrain injury - Home and community-based services Outreach activities - Quality control.

- As part of the personal care services program for eligible medical assistance
 recipients and as part of the department's services for eligible disabled and elderly
 individuals, the department shall provide home and community-based services to
 individuals who have moderate or severe impairments as a result of a traumatic brain
- 31 injury. The department shall give priority under this section to individuals whose

1 impairments are less severe or similar to those of individuals who are eligible for 2 medicaid waivers. 3 2. The department shall conduct outreach and public awareness activities regarding the 4 availability of home and community-based services to individuals who have moderate 5 or severe impairments as a result of a traumatic brain injury. 6 3. The department shall conduct quality control activities and make training available to 7 case managers and other persons providing services to individuals under this section. 8 SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 54-38-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows: 10 54-38-05. Duties of department. 11 The department shall: 12 1. Study alcoholism and drug abuse and related problems, including methods and 13 facilities available for the care, custody, detention, treatment, employment, and 14 rehabilitation of resident alcoholics and drug dependent persons. 15 2. Promote meetings and programs for the discussion of alcoholism and drug abuse or 16 any of their aspects, disseminate information on the subject of alcoholism and drug 17 abuse for the guidance and assistance of individuals, courts, and public or private 18 agencies for the prevention of alcoholism and drug abuse, and inform and educate the 19 general public on problems of alcoholism and drug abuse, their prevention and 20 treatment, to the end that alcoholism and drug abuse may be prevented and that 21 persons suffering from alcoholism or drug dependency may be disposed to seek 22 available treatment. 23 3. Conduct, promote, and finance, in full or in part, studies, investigations, and research, 24 independently or in cooperation with universities, colleges, scientific organizations, 25 and public or private agencies. 26 4. Accept for examination, diagnosis, guidance, and treatment, insofar as funds permit, 27 any resident of the state coming to the department of that person's own volition for 28 advice and guidance. For purposes of this subsection, "any resident" includes 29 veterans and nonveterans who have a traumatic brain injury. 30 5. Establish, from time to time, policies governing the evaluation, acceptance, care, and 31 treatment of alcoholics and drug dependent persons. Page No. 5 15.0467.02000

4	SEC		12. AMENDMENT. Subsection 25 of section 65-01-02 of the North Dakota	
5	Century	Code	e is amended and reenacted as follows:	
6	25.	"Permanent total disability" means disability that is the direct result of a compensable		
7		injur	y that prevents an employee from performing any work and results from any one	
8	of the following conditions:			
9		a.	Total and permanent loss of sight of both eyes;	
10		b.	Loss of both legs or loss of both feet at or above the ankle;	
11		C.	Loss of both arms or loss of both hands at or above the wrist;	
12		d.	Loss of any two of the members or faculties in subdivision a, b, or c;	
13		e.	Permanent and complete paralysis of both legs or both arms or of one leg and	
14			one arm;	
15		f.	Third-degree burns that cover at least forty percent of the body and require	
16			grafting;	
17		g.	A medically documented traumatic brain injury affecting cognitive and mental	
18			functioning which renders an employee unable to provide self-care and requires	
19			supervision or assistance with a majority of the activities of daily living; or	
20		h.	A compensable injury that results in a permanent partial impairment rating of the	
21			whole body of at least twenty-five percent pursuant to section 65-05-12.2.	
22		If the	e employee has not reached maximum medical improvement within one hundred	
23		four	weeks, the employee may receive a permanent partial impairment rating if a	
24		ratin	g will assist the organization in assessing the employee's capabilities. Entitlement	
25		to a	rating is solely within the discretion of the organization.	
26	SEC		I 13. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general	
27	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000, or so much of the			
28	sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of training and			
29	public awareness related to the expansion in eligibility for brain injury services, for the biennium			
30	beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
