## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4	<b>SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.</b> There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general
5	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$8,000,000, or so much of the
6	sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of
7	providing a grant to any school district that can demonstrate declining enrollment, for the
8	biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.

10	reflected in the district's September tenth enrollment report:
11	a. Is less than the number of students in average daily membership by at least ten;
12	and
13	b. Represents a decrease in students equal to at least two percent.

15	superintendent of public instruction shall multiply the number of students by which the
16	district declined by \$3,500.

18	obligations of this section, the superintendent of public instruction shall prorate the
19	payment based on the percentage of the total amount to which each school district is
20	entitled.

23	5. Any district that experiences a reduction in state aid as a result of section 15.1-27-
24	35.3 is not eligible to receive a grant under this section.

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY. The legislative management shall
consider studying, during the 2015-16 interim, provisions of the North Dakota Century Code that
relate to education, for the purposes of determining the requirements for school districts to
demonstrate a decline in enrollment. The legislative management shall report its findings and
recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
