- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-20 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to student attendance; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-08,
- 3 15.1-21-17, 15.1-21-18, and 15.1-21-19 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to parental
- 4 directives regarding statutorily mandated assessments; and to declare an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Administration of test or assessment - Student attendance.

- 1. If a parent directs that a test or an assessment not be administered to a child, as permitted under sections 15.1-21-08, 15.1-21-17, 15.1-21-18, and 15.1-21-19, the parent may withhold the child from school during the period of time within which normal classroom activities are not occurring because of the test or assessment administration.
- 2. A child withheld from school under the provisions of subsection 1 is deemed to be in attendance for all purposes under this title.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-21-08. Reading, mathematics, and science - Administration of test.

The superintendent of public instruction shall administer to public school students a
test that is aligned to the state content and achievement standards in reading and
mathematics. This test must be administered annually to all public school students in
grades three, four, five, six, seven, eight, and in at least one grade level selected from
nine through eleven.

- The superintendent of public instruction shall administer a test that is aligned to the state content and achievement standards in science. This test must be administered to all public school students in at least one grade level selected from three through five, in at least one grade level selected from six through nine, and in at least one grade level selected from ten and eleven.
 - 3. Prior to administering any tests required by this section, the superintendent shall provide to the parents of students under the age of eighteen notification must be informed of the proposed test and their right to direct that the test not be administered to their child. This information must be conveyed by means of a notice posted on the school district's website or by any other method determined to be appropriate by the board of the school district.
 - **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-21-17. Interim assessment.

- 1. Each school district shall administer annually to students in grades two through ten the measures of academic progress test or any other interim assessment approved by the superintendent of public instruction.
- 2. Prior to administering any test or assessment required by this section, the school district superintendent shall provide to students' parents notification parents of students must be informed of the proposed test or assessment and their right to direct that the test not be administered to their child. This information must be conveyed by means of a notice posted on the school district's website or by any other method determined to be appropriate by the board of the school district.
- **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-21-18. Career interest inventory - Educational and career planning - Consultation.

 a. A school district shall administer to students, once during their enrollment in grade seven or eight and once during their enrollment in grade nine or ten, a career interest inventory recommended by the department of career and technical education and approved by the superintendent of public instruction.

- 1 Prior to administering a career interest inventory, as required by this section, the 2 school district superintendent shall provide to the students' parents 3 notification parents of the students must be informed of the proposed career 4 interest inventory and their right to direct that the test not be administered to their 5 child. This information must be conveyed by means of a notice posted on the 6 school district's website or by any other method determined to be appropriate by 7 the board of the school district. 8 At least once during the seventh or eighth grade, each school district shall arrange for 2. 9 students to participate in either an individual consultative process or a nine-week 10 course, for the purpose of discussing the results of their career interest inventory, 11 selecting high school courses appropriate to their educational pursuits and career 12 interests, and developing individual high school education plans. 13 Each school district shall notify its high school students that, upon request, a student is 14 entitled to receive a consultative review of the student's individual high school 15 education plan at least once during each high school grade. Upon the request of a 16 student, the school district shall provide the consultative review. 17 Each school district shall verify compliance with the requirements of this section at the 18 time and in the manner required by the superintendent of public instruction. 19 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is 20 amended and reenacted as follows: 21 15.1-21-19. Summative assessment - Selection - Cost - Exemptions. 22 Except as otherwise provided, each public and nonpublic school student in grade 1. a. 23 eleven shall take the ACT, including the writing test, or three WorkKeys 24 assessments recommended by the department of career and technical education 25 and approved by the superintendent of public instruction.
 - b. The student shall determine which summative assessment to take.c. Prior to administering the summative assessment required by this si

Prior to administering the summative assessment required by this section, the school district superintendent shall provide to parents of students under the age of eighteen notification must be informed of the assessment and their right to direct that the assessment not be administered to their child.
