- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to reportable data fields; and to amend and reenact section 15.1-02-18
- 3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to duties of the state longitudinal data system
- 4 committee.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-02-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 15.1-02-18. Statewide longitudinal data system committee - Membership - Powers and

9 duties - Report to interim committee - Continuing appropriation.

- 10 1. The statewide longitudinal data system committee consists of:
- 11 a. The chancellor of the board of higher education or the chancellor's designee;
- b. The superintendent of public instruction or superintendent of public instruction's
 designee;
- 14 c. The chief information officer or <u>the</u> chief information officer's designee;
- 15 d. The director of the department of career and technical education or the director's
 16 designee;
- 17 e. The director of job service North Dakota or the director's designee;
- 18 f. The commissioner of commerce or the commissioner's designee;
- 19 g. The director of the department of human services or the director's designee;
- 20 h. The director of the North Dakota educational technology council;
- i. The director of the North Dakota council of educational leaders or the director's
 designee;
- j. The director of the North Dakota workforce development council or the director's
 designee; and

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1		k.	Two members of the legislative assembly appointed by the chairman of the	
2			legislative management.	
3	2.	The	e governor shall appointdesignate the chairman of the committee.	
4	3.	The	e committee may appoint additional committees towork groups and task forces to	
5		ser	ve the committee in an advisory capacity.	
6	4.	The	e committee shall manage a statewide longitudinal data system that:	
7		a.	Provides for the dissemination of management information to stakeholders and	
8			partners of state education, training, and employment systems; and	
9		b.	Uses data from educational and workforce systems as central sources of	
10			statewide longitudinal data.	
11	5.	The	e committee shall set policy and adopt rules relating to access to and the collection,	
12		stor	rage, and sharing of information and the systems necessary to perform those	
13		fund	ctions, subject to applicable federal and state privacy laws and interagency	
14		agr	eements and restrictions relating to confidential information required to conform to	
15		арр	licable federal and state privacy laws. The committee shall provide operational	
16		ove	rsight for information sharing activities and make recommendations for and provide	
17		ove	rsight of information sharing budgets.	
18	<u>6.</u>	The committee, in consultation with the information technology department, shall:		
19		<u>a.</u>	Establish the terms and conditions under which a person may be authorized to	
20			access data through the statewide longitudinal data system;	
21		<u>b.</u>	Direct that all statewide longitudinal data system administrators implement	
22			approved data protection practices to ensure the security of electronic and	
23			physical data, provided that the practices include requirements for encryption and	
24			staff training;	
25		<u>C.</u>	Provide for annual privacy and security audits of the statewide longitudinal data	
26			<u>system;</u>	
27		<u>d.</u>	Establish protocols, including procedures, for the notification of students and	
28			parents, in the event of a data breach involving the statewide longitudinal data	
29			system;	

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1		<u>e.</u>	Require that data retention and disposition by the statewide longitudinal data		
2			system be governed by the same policies as those instituted for the information		
3			technology department; and		
4		<u>f.</u>	Require the provision of annual training regarding data protection to any		
5			individuals who have access to the statewide longitudinal data system, including		
6			school district employees, employees of the North Dakota university system		
7			office and institutions under the control of the state board of higher education,		
8			and elected or appointed state or local governmental officials.		
9	<u>7.</u>	The	e committee may authorize studies to benefit and improve workforce training and		
10		edu	ication.		
11	6.<u>8.</u>	The	e committee shall provide a report to the information technology committee, interim		
12		con	nmittee on education issues, and interim committee on economic development on-		
13		the	status of, regarding the statewide longitudinal data system. The report must		
14		incl	ude recommendations for further development, cost proposals, proposals for		
15		legi	slation, and data sharing governance.		
16	7.<u>9.</u>	The	e committee may solicit and receive moneys from public and private sources and		
17		tho	se funds are appropriated on a continuing basis for the support of the statewide		
18		lon	gitudinal data system.		
19	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created				
20	and enacted as follows:				
21	<u>Data field - Reportable - List.</u>				
22	Prior to the beginning of each school year, a school district shall publish on its website a list				
23	of all data fields that the district will report in PowerSchool or in any other state automated				
24	reporting system, during the ensuing school year. Each district shall make the list available in				
25	printed form, upon request.
