1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota-2 Century Code, relating to reportable data fields; and to amend and reenact section 15.1-02-18 3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to duties of the state longitudinal data system-4 committee for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-07 and seven new 5 sections to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reportable data fields 6 and the statewide longitudinal data system; to repeal sections 15.1-02-18, 15.1-02-18.1, and 7 15.1-02-18.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the statewide longitudinal data 8 system; and to provide for a continuing appropriation.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

10	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-02-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11	amended and reenacted as follows:
12	15.1-02-18. Statewide longitudinal data system committee - Membership - Powers and
13	duties - Report to interim committee - Continuing appropriation.
14	1. The statewide longitudinal data system committee consists of:
15	a. The chancellor of the board of higher education or the chancellor's designee;
16	b. The superintendent of public instruction or superintendent of public instruction's
17	designee;
18	c. The chief information officer or the chief information officer's designee;
19	d. The director of the department of career and technical education or the director's-
20	designee;
21	e. The director of job service North Dakota or the director's designee;
22	f. The commissioner of commerce or the commissioner's designee;
23	g. The director of the department of human services or the director's designee;
24	h. The director of the North Dakota educational technology council;

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1	i. The director of the North Dakota council of educational leaders or the director's
2	designee;
3	j. The director of the North Dakota workforce development council or the director's
4	designee; and
5	k. Two members of the legislative assembly appointed by the chairman of the
6	legislative management.
7	2. The governor shall appointdesignate the chairman of the committee.
8	3. The committee may appoint additional committees towork groups and task forces to
9	serve the committee in an advisory capacity.
10	4. The committee shall manage a statewide longitudinal data system that:
11	a. Provides for the dissemination of management information to stakeholders and
12	partners of state education, training, and employment systems; and
13	b. Uses data from educational and workforce systems as central sources of
14	<u>statewide</u> longitudinal data.
15	5. The committee shall set policy and adopt rules relating to access to and the collection
16	storage, and sharing of information and the systems necessary to perform those
17	functions, subject to applicable federal and state privacy laws and interagency
18	agreements and restrictions relating to confidential information required to conform to
19	applicable federal and state privacy laws. The committee shall provide operational
20	oversight for information sharing activities and make recommendations for and provide
21	oversight of information sharing budgets.
22	6. The committee, in consultation with the information technology department, shall:
23	a. Establish the terms and conditions under which a person may be authorized to
24	access data through the statewide longitudinal data system;
25	<u>b.</u> <u>Direct that all statewide longitudinal data system administrators implement</u>
26	approved data protection practices to ensure the security of electronic and
27	physical data, provided that the practices include requirements for encryption and
28	staff training:
29	c. Provide for biennial privacy and security audits of the statewide longitudinal data
30	system;

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1	<u>d.</u> Establish protocols, including procedures, for the notification of students and
2	parents, in the event of a data breach involving the statewide longitudinal data
3	system;
4	e. Require that data retention and disposition by the statewide longitudinal data
5	system be governed by the same policies as those instituted for the information
6	technology department; and
7	f. Require the provision of annual training regarding data protection to any
8	individuals who have access to the statewide longitudinal data system, including
9	school district employees, employees of the North Dakota university system
10	office and institutions under the control of the state board of higher education,
11	and elected or appointed state or local governmental officials.
12	<u>7.</u> The committee may authorize studies to benefit and improve workforce training and
13	education.
14	— 6.8. The committee shall provide a report to the information technology committee, interim-
15	committee on education issues, and interim committee on economic development on
16	the status of, regarding the statewide longitudinal data system. The report must-
17	include recommendations for further development, cost proposals, proposals for
18	legislation, and data sharing governance.
19	7.9. The committee may solicit and receive moneys from public and private sources and
20	those funds are appropriated on a continuing basis for the support of the statewide
21	longitudinal data system.
22	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
23	and enacted as follows:
24	Data field - Reportable - List.
25	Prior to the beginning of each school year, a school district shall publish on its website a list
26	of all data fields that the district will report in PowerSchool or in any other state automated
27	reporting system, during the ensuing school year. Each district shall make the list available in
28	printed form, upon request.
29	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
30	and enacted as follows:

1	Pro	tection of student data - School district policy.
2	1	The board of each school district shall adopt a policy regarding the protection of
3		student data.
4	2.	The policy must require that permission be obtained from the board before any student
5		data is shared with an individual who is not a school district employee or shared with
6		any other entity. This provision does not apply to the sharing of data with a student's
7		parent or to the sharing of data, if required by law.
8	3.	The policy must require the school district superintendent to compile:
9		a. A list of all individuals with whom, and entities with which, student data is shared;
10		<u>and</u>
11		b. A list, by title, of all school district personnel who have access to student data.
12	4.	A school district shall make copies of the policy available upon request.
13	SEC	CTION 2. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
14	and ena	cted as follows:
15	Sta	tewide longitudinal data system committee - Membership.
16	1.	The statewide longitudinal data system committee consists of:
17		a. The commissioner of the board of higher education or the commissioner's
18		<u>designee;</u>
19		b. The superintendent of public instruction or the superintendent's designee;
20		c. The chief information officer or the officer's designee;
21		d. The director of the department of career and technical education or the director's
22		designee;
23		e. The director of job service North Dakota or the director's designee;
24		f. The commissioner of commerce or the commissioner's designee;
25		g. The director of the department of human services or the director's designee;
26		h. The director of the North Dakota educational technology council;
27		i. The executive director of the North Dakota council of educational leaders or the
28		executive director's designee;
29		j. The director of the North Dakota workforce development council or the director's
30		designee; and

1		k. Two members of the legislative assembly appointed by the chairman of the
2		legislative management.
3	2.	The governor shall designate the chairman of the committee.
4	SEC	CTION 3. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
5	and ena	cted as follows:
6	Stat	tewide longitudinal data system committee - Duties.
7	1.	The statewide longitudinal data system committee shall manage a statewide
8		longitudinal data system that:
9		a. Provides for the dissemination of management information to stakeholders and
10		partners of state education, training, and employment systems; and
11		b. Uses data from educational and workforce systems as central sources of
12		statewide longitudinal data.
13	2.	The statewide longitudinal data system committee shall establish policies and adopt
14		rules addressing access to and the collection, storage, and sharing of information and
15		the systems necessary to perform those functions, subject to applicable federal and
16		state privacy laws and interagency agreements and restrictions relating to confidential
17		information required to conform to applicable federal and state privacy laws.
18	3.	The statewide longitudinal data system committee shall provide operational oversight
19		for information sharing activities and make recommendations for and provide oversight
20		of information sharing budgets.
21	4.	The statewide longitudinal data system committee in consultation with the information
22		technology department shall:
23		a. Establish the terms and conditions under which a person may be authorized to
24		access data through the statewide longitudinal data system;
25		b. Direct that all statewide longitudinal data system administrators implement
26		approved data protection practices to ensure the security of electronic and
27		physical data, provided that the practices include requirements for encryption and
28		staff training;
29		c. Provide for biennial privacy and security audits of the statewide longitudinal data

12	SEC	TION 4. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
13	and ena	cted as follows:
14	Stat	ewide longitudinal data system committee - Powers.
15	1	The statewide longitudinal data system committee may authorize studies to benefit
16		and improve workforce training and education.
17	2.	The statewide longitudinal data system committee may appoint additional work groups
18		and task forces to serve in an advisory capacity.
19	SEC	TION 5. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
20	and ena	cted as follows:
21	Stat	ewide longitudinal data system committee - Report to legislative management.
22	<u>Duri</u>	ng each interim the statewide longitudinal data system committee shall provide a report
23	regardin	g the statewide longitudinal data system to one or more committees designated by the
24	<u>legislativ</u>	re management and shall provide recommendations for further development, cost
25	proposa	s, proposals for legislation, and recommendations for data sharing governance.
26	SEC	TION 6. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
27	and ena	cted as follows:
28	Stat	ewide longitudinal data system committee - Continuing appropriation.
29	The	statewide longitudinal data system committee may solicit and receive gifts, grants, and
30	donation	s from public and private sources. Any moneys received in accordance with this section
31	are appr	opriated on a continuing basis for the support of the statewide longitudinal data system.

1	SEC	CTION 7. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
2	and ena	cted as follows:
3	Stat	tewide longitudinal data system committee - Information technology department.
4	1.	The information technology department, at the direction of the statewide longitudinal
5		data system committee, shall maintain a statewide longitudinal data system among
6		education, workforce, and training entities.
7	2.	The information technology department and the statewide longitudinal data system
8		committee may, subject to federal and state privacy laws, enter interagency
9		agreements, including agreements designating authorized representatives of the
10		educational agencies participating in the system, pursuant to the Family Educational
11		Rights and Privacy Act [20 U.S.C. 1232g; 34 CFR 99].
12	3.	The information technology department shall staff and provide other necessary
13		support to the statewide longitudinal data system committee.
14	SEC	CTION 8. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
15	and ena	cted as follows:
16	Stat	te agencies - Mandatory provision of information - Confidentiality.
17	1.	The information technology department may request from any state agency:
18		a. All information required by 20 U.S.C. 9871(e)(2)(D); and
19		b. Any other educational information the statewide longitudinal data system
20		committee determines is required for a longitudinal data system to comply with
21		state or federal law.
22	2.	Subject to applicable restrictions on the use and disclosure of confidential information
23		required to comply with federal and state privacy laws, any state agency receiving a
24		request for information under subsection 1 shall provide the information at the time
25		and in the manner required by the information technology department.
26	SEC	CTION 9. REPEAL. Sections 15.1-02-18, 15.1-02-18.1, and 15.1-02-18.2 of the North
27	Dakota	Century Code are repealed.
