1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 18-01 and a new chapter to-

2 title 43 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the plan approval, and inspection, and

3 testing of fire sprinkler systems and fire sprinkler system licenses; and to provide a penalty; and

4 <u>to provide an effective date</u>.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 18-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
7 and enacted as follows:

8	<u>Fire</u>	<u>sprinkler systems plan approval, and inspections, and testing.</u>
9	<u>1.</u>	The fire marshal or the fire marshal's designee under section 18-01-03.2 shall review
10		all building and sprinkler plans for public or private buildings prior to the installation of
11		a fire sprinkler system to determine compliance with the applicable code standards of
12		the national fire protection association fire marshal or fire marshal's designee.
13	<u>2.</u>	During installation or immediately after installation of a fire sprinkler system in a public
14		or private building, the fire marshal or the fire marshal's designee under section
15		18-01-03.2 shall inspect the fire sprinkler system and observe the acceptance test the
16		fire sprinkler system to determine compliance with applicable code standards of the
17		national fire protection association.
18	<u>3.</u>	The owner of any building containing a fire sprinkler system shall have the fire
19		sprinkler system inspected by the fire marshal or the fire marshal's designee under
20		section 18-01-03.2 pursuant to the schedule established by the national fire protection
21		association to assure compliance with applicable code standards of the national fire
22		protection association and to determine whether any changes in the building or in the
23		contents of the building requires modification of the fire sprinkler system.

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1	<u> <u>4. </u></u>	—In accordance with subsection 4 of section 54-21.3-03, single family dwellings or
2		residential buildings that do not contain more than two dwelling units are not subject to
3		this section.
4	<u>5.4.</u>	The fire marshal shall establish and publish a fee schedule for the review of building.
5		plans and sprinkler system inspections as required by this section and conducted by
6		the fire marshal. A fire marshal's designee under section 18-01-03.2 who conducts a
7		review or inspection under this section shall use the state fire marshal's fee schedule
8		or may use a fee schedule approved by the fire marshalmay establish a fee schedule
9		for permits, plan review, and inspections.
10		CTION 2. A new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
11	enacted	las follows:
12	<u>Def</u>	initions.
13	<u>— As ı</u>	used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
14	<u> <u> </u></u>	
15		sprinkler fitter, who:
16		a. Is engaged in learning and assisting in the practical installing, testing, inspecting,
17		dismantling to terminate, and repairing of fire sprinkler systems, under the
18		supervision of a licensed journeyman fire sprinkler fitter and a fire sprinkler
19		contractor; and
20		b. Is in a registered apprenticeship program under state or federal law.
21	<u> <u> 2. </u></u>	
22	<u> <u> </u></u>	a. "Fire sprinkler contractor" means any contractor who has paid the annual fee and
23		obtained a license to conduct a business in the designing, installing, inspecting,
24		testing, dismantling to terminate service, maintaining, or repairing of fire sprinkler
25		systems; who employs any licensed professional engineer in the appropriate field
26		of competence; or who:
27		(1) Submits to the board satisfactory proof of having successfully completed an
28		accredited course in fire sprinkler engineering technologies or design;
29		(2) Submits a letter from the national institute for certification in engineering
30		technologies or other accredited school verifying successful completion of

1	the examination for level III fire sprinkler engineering technologies or design	
2	<u>Of</u>	
3	(3) Holds a current equivalent fire sprinkler designer's license issued by any	
4	other state or Canadian province; and	
5	(4) Has registered with the board.	
6	<u><u>b.</u> Fire sprinkler contractors are designated under the following types:</u>	
7	(1) "Designer contractor" means a person who contracts to design a fire	
8	protection system or its parts or related equipment.	
9	(2) "Fire protection contractor" means a person who contracts to sell, design,	
10	install, modify, alter, or inspect a fire protection system or its parts or related	-
11	equipment.	
12	(3) "Limited contractor" means a person who performs fire protection-related	
13	work on premises or that part of premises actually occupied by the	
14	contractor and owned by the contractor or leased by the contractor for a	
15	period of at least one year. No insurance or bond is required for a limited	
16	contractor.	
17	<u>4. "Fire sprinkler system" means an integrated overhead piping system designed in</u>	
18	accordance with fire protection engineering standards, including:	
19	a. The system includes at least one automatic water supply.	
20	<u>b.</u> The aboveground portion of the system is a scheduled or hydraulically designed	
21	piping installed in a building, structure, or area, generally overhead, to which	
22	sprinklers are attached in a systematic pattern.	
23	<u>c. The valve controlling each system riser is located in a system riser or its supply</u>	
24	piping.	
25	<u>d. Each system riser includes a device for activating an alarm when the system is in</u>	Ξ
26	operation.	
27	e. The system is usually activated by heat from a fire and discharges water over the	Ξ
28	fire area.	
29	<u>5. "Journeyman sprinkler fitter" means any individual:</u>	
30	<u>a. With a minimum of eight thousand hours of experience as a fire sprinkler fitter;</u>	
31	<u>b.</u> Who has paid the annual fee for license as a journeyman fire sprinkler fitter;	

1	<u>c. Who has obtained a license as a journeyman fire sprinkler fitter; and</u>
2	<u>d.</u> Who is engaged in the practical installing, inspecting, testing, dismantling to
3	terminate service, maintaining, and repairing of fire sprinkler systems.
4	e. The board may determine alternative experience as deemed acceptable to the
5	board.
6	
7	<u>— The board consists of five members appointed by the governor. One member must be an</u>
8	employee of the board, and that member shall serve as secretary of the board; one member
9	must be selected from a local fire service jurisdiction; one member must be a licensed
10	journeyman fire sprinkler fitter; one member must be a fire sprinkler contractor or an employee
11	of a fire sprinkler contractor; and one member must be a consumer at large. Board members
12	shall serve four-year terms, except the governor shall appoint the initial members to terms of
13	four years or less so the terms of no more than two members expire each year. Each member
14	of the board is entitled to reimbursement for actual expenses incurred in performance of official
15	duties as provided for state officials and employees.
16	<u>Rulemaking.</u>
17	<u>—_1. The board shall adopt rules governing:</u>
18	a. Initial and subsequent competence, qualifications, examinations, and licensing of
19	fire sprinkler contractors and journeyman fire sprinkler fitters;
20	<u> </u>
21	
22	<u>2. The board is responsible for registration of fire sprinkler journeyman sprinkler fitters,</u>
23	designers, contractors, and apprentice fire sprinkler fitters.
24	<u>License requirement.</u>
25	<u>A person may not install, test, dismantle to terminate service, modify, alter, maintain, or</u>
26	make a maintenance inspection on a fire sprinkler system or offer to do so unless licensed as a
27	journeyman sprinkler fitter or as an apprentice engaged in learning or working under a
28	journeyman sprinkler fitter.
29	<u>Exceptions.</u>
30	- <u>1. A person does not need a fire protection contractor license to maintain a fire protection</u>
31	system. "Maintain" means the scheduled activities to keep a fire suppression system

1	operable. "Maintain" also means to make emergency repairs to correct an impairment
2	of a fire protection system until such time as a licensed fire protection contractor can
3	do permanent repairs.
4	<u>2. Maintain shall not mean the practice of engaging in required activities prescribed by</u>
5	NFPA 25, as adopted by the state fire marshal's office.
6	<u>-3. A license is not required to perform emergency repairs on exiting installations. An</u>
7	emergency repair must be inspected by a licensed journeyman fire sprinkler fitter or
8	authority having jurisdiction as soon as possible.
9	<u>Issuances of licenses.</u>
10	<u>— The board shall issue licenses annually and registers under this chapter. A license expires</u>
11	on December thirty-first of each year unless otherwise revoked. Annual renewal must be
12	submitted on forms provided by the board.
13	<u>Conceptual drawing, plan, or design for system requirements.</u>
14	— <u>A fire sprinkler contractor must be licensed or registered with the board before preparing a</u>
15	conceptual drawing, plan, or design for a fire sprinkler system. The drawing, plan, or design
16	must include the license number of the contractor and designer. A fire sprinkler contractor may
17	obtain design services from any designer registered with the board.
18	<u>Journeyman fire sprinkler fitter licenses.</u>
19	<u>Journeyman fire sprinkler fitter license reciprocity may be available with other states if the</u>
20	other state reciprocates with this state, the other state has equal or more stringent
21	requirements, and the journeyman fire sprinkler fitter has applied for a North Dakota license and
22	has paid the required fee to this state. The board may not restrict any licensed journeyman fire
23	sprinkler fitter's work to any geographical territory. No work shall take place on any active job
24	site unless a licensed journeyman fire sprinkler fitter is present.
25	<u>Fees.</u>
26	<u>— Fees, fines, and permits must fund all enforcement and administrative costs for issuing</u>
27	licenses and registrations under this chapter. The following fees must be paid to the board:
28	<u> Fire sprinkler contractor annual license fee, two hundred fifty dollars. </u>
29	<u>2. Fire sprinkler designer contractor annual license fee, one hundred dollars.</u>
30	<u>— 3. Fire sprinkler limited contractor annual license fee, fifteen dollars.</u>
31	<u>4. Journeyman sprinkler fitter annual license fee, one hundred dollars.</u>

1	<u>5.</u> Fire sprinkler designer annual registration fee, fifteen dollars.
2	
3	A fire sprinkler contractor must have one of the following:
4	<u>1. A general liability insurance policy that:</u>
5	<u>a. Includes products and complete operation coverage;</u>
6	<u>b.</u> Provides insurance coverage of at least two hundred thousand dollars per-
7	person, five hundred thousand dollars per occurrence, and one million dollars
8	property damage; and
9	
10	<u>2.</u> <u>A bond that:</u>
11	a. Is for the total penal sum of thirty thousand dollars conditioned upon the faithful
12	and lawful performance of all work within the state;
13	b. Is for the benefit of persons injured or suffering financial loss by reason of failures
14	of performance;
15	<u> </u>
16	<u>d. Is written by a corporate surety licensed to do business in the state, or is a cash</u>
17	bond, or is an irrevocable line of credit; and
18	e. Contains a stipulation that the bond may not be canceled, terminated, or changed
19	in a way so that it no longer meets the requirements of this subsection, except
20	upon thirty days prior written notice to the board.
21	Penalty and fines.
22	- A first willful violation of this chapter is a class B misdemeanor, and the board may impose a
23	penalty of not more than five hundred dollars. A second willful violation of this chapter is a
24	class A misdemeanor, and the board may impose a penalty of not more than one thousand
25	dollars. A third or subsequent willful violation of this chapter is a class A misdemeanor, and the
26	board may impose a penalty of not more than one thousand dollars. A separate violation occurs
27	each day the violation continues.
28	
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30	the holder has:
31	<u>— 1. Obtained or attempted to obtain a license by fraudulent misrepresentation.</u>

1	<u>— 2. Committed malpractice or exhibited incompetency in the installation or servicing of any</u>
2	fire sprinkler equipment.
3	<u>3.</u> <u>Serviced and failed to provide written notification to the owner and the authority having</u>
4	jurisdiction of any deficiencies found in the fire system.
5	<u>4. Employed a person who installs or services fire sprinkler equipment without the</u>
6	required license.
7	-5. Violated any of the conditions, qualifications, or limitations set forth in the license or
8	allows the license to be used by anyone other than the person or entity to whom the
9	license was issued.
10	Revocation - Hearing.
11	 A license issued under this chapter may be revoked only after a hearing of the charges by
12	the board. The holder of the license must be notified in writing by the board of the charges
13	against the holder and of the time and place fixed for the hearing. Such notice must be served
14	by registered or certified mail, addressed to the post-office address of the licenseholder as
15	shown in the holder's license. The time set for the hearing must be not less than ten days after
16	the service of the notice. The hearing must be public and full opportunity must be given the
17	accused to produce witnesses and evidence in the accused's own behalf and to examine the
18	witnesses against the accused. After hearing all the evidence, the board shall render its
19	decision in writing and the accused must be furnished, by mail, a copy thereof. If the accused is
20	found guilty of any offense for which revocation of the license is provided, the license is revoked
21	automatically.
22	<u> — Revocation of license - When reinstated.</u>
23	— A person whose license issued under this chapter has been revoked by the board may not
24	be permitted to apply for a license for a period of one year from the date of the revocation. After
25	the expiration of such time, the board may consider an application for reinstatement of such
26	person and upon a showing that the disability has been removed or that there is no further
27	likelihood that the offense will be repeated, the board may reinstate the license.
28	<u>Continuing education requirements.</u>
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30	are required to attend eight hours of continuing education courses on the performance of fire
31	sprinkler-related work. All continuing education courses must be in the form of a workshop,

1	seminar, or educational conference approved by the board. Certificates of continuing education
2	shall be submitted with annual renewals. Education may be taken in person or online.
3	Fitter licensed by board may practice at any place in state - Exception.
4	<u>A fitter registered and licensed by the board to engage in the business of journeyman fitter,</u>
5	or fitter's apprentice may engage in or work at the business of plumbing at any place in this
6	state, except in cities that have adopted ordinances requiring a municipal license or registration
7	in addition to the state license before permitting any fitter to work in such municipality.
8	<u>Journeyman sprinkler fitter grandfather period.</u>
9	 After December 31, 2015, sprinkler fitters who can demonstrate to the board that they have
10	attained journeyman status with their employer, applicable training program, or documented
11	experience, no later than June 30, 2017, shall be deemed a journeyman sprinkler fitter.
12	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on January 1, 2016.
