1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-10-47 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to vehicles obstructing highways; and to amend and reenact section 39-10-48 of the

3 North Dakota Century Code, relating to vehicles illegally parked on highways.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-10-47 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7	39-10-47.	Stopping, standing,	or parking outside	of business	or residence districts.

Upon any highway outside of a business or residence district no personAn individual 9 may not stop, park, or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended. 10 upon the paved or main-traveled part of theany highway when if it is practicable to 11 stop, park, or so leave such the vehicle off such part of said the paved or main-traveled 12 part of the highway, but in every event an. There must be an unobstructed width of the 13 highway of not less than twelve feet [3.66 meters] opposite a standing vehicle must be-14 left for the free passage of other vehicles and a clear view of suchany stopped 15 vehicles vehicle must be available from a distance of not less than two hundred feet 16 [60.96 meters] in each direction upon suchthe highway.

17 2. ThisUnless the vehicle is blocking the highway or is otherwise endangering public.
18 safety, this section and sections 39-10-49 and 39-10-50 do not apply to the driver of
19 anya vehicle which is disabled while on the paved or main-traveled portion of a
20 highway in such manner and to such extent that it is impossible to avoid , if stopping
21 and temporarily leaving such the disabled vehicle in such position is unavoidable.

- <u>3.</u> Without the consent of the owner or driver of a vehicle and if a vehicle or any personal
 property or cargo spilled from the vehicle is blocking the highway or is otherwise
- 24 <u>endangering public safety, a police officer may:</u>

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1		a. Remove the vehicle or cause the vehicle to be removed from the highway; and		
2		b. Remove or cause to be removed any personal property or cargo that may have		
3		been spilled from the vehicle onto the highway.		
4	<u>4.</u>	Alf reasonable care is used in the removal process, a police officer and the police		
5		officer's employing agency, the department of transportation or an employee of the		
6		department of transportation, or a political subdivision or employee of a political		
7		subdivision authorized by a police officer, and any tow truck operator or towing		
8		company authorized by a police officer is not liable in civil damages for loss or damage		
9		to any vehicle or to any personal property or cargo that may have spilled from a		
10		vehicle that is removed from a highway under this section.

16	<u>5.</u>	<u>A pc</u>	lice officer and the police officer's employing agency, the department of
17		tran	sportation or an employee of the department of transportation, or a political

19		any	tow truck operator or towing company authorized by a police officer is not liable in
20		<u>civil</u>	damages for loss or damage to any vehicle removed from a highway or state
