- A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota

 Century Code, relating to lifetime hunting licenses; and to provide for a legislative management study. For an Act to provide for a game and fish department study and a report to the legislative

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows: 8 Resident small game lifetime license - Special fund. 9 The director shall issue a small game lifetime license to a qualified resident as 10 provided in this section. The license is not refundable and not transferable. The 11 license exempts the resident from yearly fees for the resident certificate, the habitat-12 restoration stamp, and the small game license; however, the resident must apply on 13 an annual basis. A qualified resident is an individual who at the time of application 14 has been a resident of this state for one year or is a minor child of a person who has 15 been a resident of this state for one year. If a qualified resident becomes a 16 nonresident, the license is valid for that individual as a nonresident, but all other-17 licenses must be obtained on a nonresident basis. The fee for a lifetime resident 18 license is: 19 One hundred sixty dollars for applicants under four years of age. 20 Two hundred seventy five dollars for applicants over three years of age and 21 under sixteen years of age. 22 Four hundred dollars for applicants over fifteen years of age and under fifty years 23 of age. 24 One hundred ninety dollars for applicants over fifty years of age.

2. Moneys collected under this section must be placed in a special lifetime license fund in the state treasury.

SECTION 2. LIFETIME HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSES - LEGISLATIVE

MANAGEMENT STUDY. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the feasibility and desirability of game and fish department offering lifetime licenses to residents and nonresidents for fishing and hunting, including furbearer and combination licenses. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.

FISHING LICENSES - LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT REPORT. The game and fish department shall study the feasibility and desirability of lifetime hunting and fishing licenses. The study must address other states' laws, appropriate pricing, the affect on federal funding, which licenses should be lifetime, and which licensees should qualify for lifetime licenses. Before September 1, 2016, the department shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any proposed legislation necessary to implement the recommendations, to the legislative management.
