1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state auditor; to

2 create and enact a new section to chapter 54-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to

3 a higher education audit division of the state auditor's office; and to amend and reenact sections

4 54-10-01 and 54-10-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers and duties of

5 the state auditor and the salary of the state auditor.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
other income, to the state auditor for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state auditor,
for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, as follows:

1		with conducting a performance audit of a state agency without the prior approval of the
2		legislative audit and fiscal review committee. The state auditor shall notify an agency
3		of the need for a consultant before requesting approval by the legislative audit and
4		fiscal review committee. The agency that is audited shall pay for the cost of any
5		consultant approved.
6	5.	For the audits and reviews the state auditor is authorized to perform or provide for
7		under this section, the audit or review may be provided for by contract with a private
8		certified or licensed public accountant or other qualified professional. If the state
9		auditor determines that the audit or review will be done pursuant to contract, the state
10		auditor, except for occupational or professional boards, shall execute the contract, and
11		any executive branch agency, including higher education institutions, shall pay the
12		fees of the contractor.
13	6.	Be responsible for the above functions and report thereon to the governor and the
14		secretary of state in accordance with section 54-06-04 or more often as circumstances
15		may require.
16	7.	Perform all other duties as prescribed by law.
17	17 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 54-10-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
18	18 amended and reenacted as follows:	
19	54-	10-10. Salary of state auditor.
20	0 The annual salary of the state auditor is ninety-six thousand seven hundred ninety-four	
21	dollars through June 30, 2014, and ninety-nine thousand six hundred ninety-eightone hundred	
22	2 two thousand six hundred eighty-nine dollars through June 30, 2016, and one hundred five	
23	3 thousand seven hundred seventy dollars thereafter.	
24	SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 54-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created	
25	and enacted as follows:	
26	State board of higher education audits - Higher education audit division.	
27	<u>1.</u>	The state auditor shall establish a higher education audit division and employ a
28		division audit manager to perform all audit related functions of the state board of
29		higher education, including the examination and evaluation of the adequacy and
30		effectiveness of the board's governance, risk management, internal controls,
31		performance of constitutionally and statutorily required duties, and other areas as

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1		determined by the state auditor. The audit manager shall conduct audits, as
2		determined appropriate by the state auditor, of each institution under the supervision
3		and control of the state board of higher education. The audit manager may consult
4		with the state board of higher education, or a committee designated by the board,
5		regarding audit plans, results of audit activities, and any other appropriate issue. The
6		state auditor shall determine the audit scope and related audit areas of any audit
7		conducted by the audit manager. This section does not require the state auditor to
8		perform any duties that would compromise the auditor's independence under
9		government auditing standards.
10	<u>2.</u>	The audit manager may access and examine any record under the control of the state
11		board of higher education. For purposes of reviewing records under the Family
12		Educational Rights and Privacy Act [20 U.S.C. 1232g; 34 CFR 99] or any other federal
13		privacy law, the audit manager must be considered a state educational official
14		authorized to access student records for audit purposes.
15	<u>3.</u>	The state auditor may hire employees necessary to carry out the duties and
16		responsibilities of this section. The state auditor may hire consultants to assist with
17		any duties required under this section subject to approval by the legislative audit and
18		fiscal review committee. The state board of higher education shall pay for the cost of
19		any consultant approved under this section.
