A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-02-13, 15.1-08-06, 15.1-14-04,

15.1-21-12, 15.1-21-19, and 15.1-27-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the provision of statutorily required school district data; and to repeal sections 15.1-06-18 and 15.1-09-35 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to school data reports for an act to provide for a legislative management study.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7	.SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-02-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
8	amended and reenacted as follows:		
9	15.1-02-13. School district employee compensation report.		
10	1. Before On or before September eleventh tenth of each year, each school district shall		
11	report the following information to the superintendent of public instruction, with respect-		
12	to each teacher and class of teachers and with respect to each administrator and class-		
13	of administrators:		
14	a. The number of days each was employed during the preceding school year.		
15	b. The base salaries.		
16	c. The amount of compensation provided for extended contracts.		
17	d. The amount of compensation provided for cocurricular activities.		
18	e. The amount expended for contract buyouts.		
19	f. The amount of compensation provided in lieu of salaries.		
20	g. The amount paid for signing bonuses.		
21	h. The amount of compensation provided for substitute teaching and workload		
22	adjustment.		
23	i. The amount of compensation provided for any other purposes.		
24	j. The amount expended for health insurance benefits.		

1	k. The amount expended for dental, vision, and cancer insurance benefits.
2	I. The amount expended for life and long-term disability insurance benefits.
3	m. The amount of retirement contributions and assessments, including individual-
4	shares if paid by the district.
5	n. The district's share of Federal Insurance Contributions Act taxes.
6	o. The amount of dues or membership fees paid by the district.
7	p. Any other benefits provided by the district.
8	2. In addition to the requirements of subsection 1, each school district shall also indicate:
9	a. Whether each teacher and administrator is employed on a full-time or a part-time
10	basis.
11	b. The number of days used to determine the base salary of each teacher and
12	administrator.
13	3. The superintendent of public instruction shall:
14	a. Compile the information required by this section in a manner that allows for
15	accurate comparisons; and
16	b. Forward a copy of the compiled information to the governor and the legislative
17	council.
18	4. The superintendent of public instruction may not expand the reporting requirements of
19	this section.
20	5. If any school district fails without good cause to provide the information required by
21	this section on or before September tenth and in the manner directed by the
22	superintendent of public instruction, the superintendent shall withhold all state aid until
23	the information is received. On August twenty-seventh, the superintendent of public
24	instruction shall provide to each school district superintendent electronic notification
25	regarding the date on which the employee compensation report required by this
26	section is due.
27	6. If because of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school district is unable-
28	to file the district's employee compensation report with the superintendent of public
29	instruction before five p.m. on September tenth, the school district superintendent may
30	request one extension from the superintendent of public instruction. The
31	superintendent of public instruction shall grant the extension provided the request was

1		received before five p.m. on September tenth. An extension under this section		
2	terminates at five p.m. on September twenty-fourth.			
3	7. If an extension is not requested as provided for in subsection 6, or if the school			
4		district's employee compensation report is not filed within the extended time period, as		
5	set forth in subsection 6, the superintendent of public instruction shall subtract f			
6	any state aid otherwise payable to the school district the prorated amount for each			
7	beyond September tenth that the report is not on file with the superintendent of publi			
8	instruction.			
9	<u>6.8.</u>	For purposes of this section:		
10		a. "Administrator" includes an individual who is employed by a school district in an		
11		administrative position and who is classified by the superintendent of public-		
12		instruction as:		
13		(1) A class 67 school district superintendent;		
14		(2) A class 66 assistant or associate superintendent;		
15		(3) A class 53 principal;		
16		(4) A class 05 assistant principal;		
17		(5) A class 29 director, including a special education director and a career and		
18		technical education director;		
19	-	(6) A class 04 assistant director; and		
20	-	(7) Any other individual whose position requires an administrator's credential.		
21		b. "Teacher" means an individual, other than an administrator, who is licensed to-		
22		teach by the education standards and practices board or approved to teach by		
23		the education standards and practices board and who is employed by the board-		
24		of a school district in a position classified by the superintendent of public		
25		instruction as:		
26		(1) A class 22 coordinator;		
27		(2) A class 37 guidance counselor or school counselor;		
28		(3) A class 38 guidance counselor designate;		
29		(4) A class 40 instructional programmer;		
30		(5) A class 41 library media specialist;		
31		(6) A class 56 pupil personnel service provider;

2	(8) A class 62 speech-language pathologist;

6	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-08-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
7	amended and reenacted as follows:		
8	15.1-08-06. Military installation - School districts - Application of other laws.		
9	1. The duties set forth in section 15.1-09-28 are applicable to the president of a school		
10	board governing a military installation school district established under this chapter.		
11	2. The duties set forth in sections section 15.1-09-33 and 15.1-09-35 are applicable to a		
12	school board governing a military installation school district established under this		
13	chapter unless other agreements have been reached.		
14	3. The duties set forth in sections 15.1-07-21, 15.1-07-23, and 15.1-07-24 are applicable		
15	to the business manager of a military installation school district established under this		
16	chapter.		
17	4. The compensation and expense reimbursement levels set forth in section 15.1-09-06		
18	are applicable to members of a school board governing a military installation school-		
19	district established under this chapter.		
20	5. Sections 15.1-07-10 through 15.1-07-13 and section 15.1-07-25 are applicable to		
21	military installation school districts established under this chapter.		
22	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-14-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
23	amended and reenacted as follows:		
24	— 15.1-14-04. School district superintendent - Grounds for dismissal.		
25	— The board of a school district may dismiss a school district superintendent prior to the		
26	expiration of the individual's contract for any of the following causes:		
27	— 1. Immoral conduct.;		
28	— 2. Insubordination.;		
29	- 3. Conviction of a felony.;		
30	4. Conduct unbecoming the position of superintendent.;		
31	5. Failure to perform contracted duties without justification:		

1	6. Failure to file a statutorily mandated report or statutorily mandated information, at the
2	required time and in the required manner;
3	7. Gross inefficiency that the superintendent has failed to correct after written notice.;
4	7.8. Continuing physical or mental disability that renders the superintendent unfit or unable
5	to perform the superintendent's duties; or
6	9. Any act or omission that results in a loss of state aid payments to which the district is
7	otherwise entitled.
8	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is-
9	amended and reenacted as follows:
10	15.1-21-12. Professional development - Use of available funds.
11	1. On or before October first of each year, each school district shall file a report with the
12	superintendent of public instruction indicatingwhich:
13	a. The Indicates the amount and source of funds that were made available to the
14	district for professional development during the preceding school year;
15	b. The Indicates the amount and source of funds that were expended by the district
16	for professional development during the preceding school year; and
17	c. A separate <u>Includes a</u> list of the professional development activities in which the
18	district participated during the preceding school year and the amount of time-
19	committed to the activities.
20	2. The superintendent of public instruction shall compile the information submitted under
21	this section to determine how much of the available funding for professional-
22	development was used by school districts in this state and, beginning with the reports-
23	due on or before October 1, 2002, whether the expenditure correlated with increased
24	student achievement on the reading and mathematics tests required by section
25	15.1-21-08.
26	3. On September seventeenth, the superintendent of public instruction shall provide to
27	each school district superintendent electronic notification regarding the date on which
28	the professional development report required by this section is due.
29	4. If because of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school district is unable
30	to file the district's professional development report with the superintendent of public
31	instruction before five p.m. on October first, the school district superintendent may

1	superintendent shall cause an audit to be conducted in order to obtain the
2	information. All costs of the audit are the responsibility of the nonpublic school.
3	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-27-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	amended and reenacted as follows:
5	— 15.1-27-02. Per student payments - Required reports.
6	1. a. The On or before October first of each year, the superintendent of a school district
7	shall file with the superintendent of public instruction may not forward state aid
8	payments to a school district beyond the October payment unless the district has-
9	filed the following with the superintendent:
10	a. (1) The June thirtieth A student membership and attendance report, for the
11	school year ending on the preceding June thirtieth;
12	b. (2) An annual school district financial report, for the school year ending on the
13	preceding June thirtieth;
14	c. (3) The September tenth fall A student enrollment report, as of September tenth
15	in the current school year; and
16	d. (4) The personnel Personnel report forms for licensed and nonlicensed
17	employeesindividuals, employed by the district for the current school year.
18	b. Fourteen days before the date on which a report required by this section is due,
19	the superintendent of public instruction shall provide to each school district
20	superintendent electronic notification regarding the date by which the report is
21	due.
22	c. If because of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school district is
23	unable to provide the report to the superintendent of public instruction before
24	five p.m. on the date by which the report is due, the school district superintendent
25	may request one extension from the superintendent of public instruction. The
26	superintendent of public instruction shall grant the extension provided the request
27	was received before five p.m. on the due date. An extension under this section
28	terminates at five p.m. on the fourteenth day after the due date.
29	d. If an extension is not requested as provided for in subdivision c, or if the report is
30	not filed within the extended time period, as set forth in subdivision c, the
31	superintendent of public instruction shall subtract from any state aid otherwise

1		payable to the school district the prorated amount for each day beyond the initial	
2		due date that the report is not on file with the superintendent of public instruction.	
3	<u> 2. a.</u>	On or before December fifteenth, each school district shall file with the	
4		superintendent of public instruction the taxable valuation and mill levy	
5		certifications. If a district fails to file the taxable valuation and mill levy	
6		certifications by the required date, the superintendent of public instruction may	
7		not forward to the district any state aid payments to which the district is entitled,	
8		until the taxable valuation and mill levy certifications are filed.	
9	<u>b.</u>	On December first, the superintendent of public instruction shall provide to each	
10		school district superintendent electronic notification regarding the date on which	
11		the taxable valuation and mill levy certifications required by this section are due.	
12	<u> </u>	If because of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school district is	
13		unable to file the taxable valuation and mill levy certifications with the	
14		superintendent of public instruction before five p.m. on December fifteenth, the	
15		school district superintendent may request one extension from the	
16		superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall	
17		grant the extension provided the request was received before five p.m. on	
18		December fifteenth. An extension under this section terminates at five p.m. on	
19		December twenty-ninth.	
20	<u>d.</u>	If an extension is not requested by the school district superintendent as provided	
21		for in subdivision c or if the district's taxable valuation and mill levy certifications	
22		are not filed within the extended time period, as set forth in subdivision c, the	
23		superintendent of public instruction shall subtract from any state aid otherwise	
24		payable to the school district the prorated amount for each day beyond	
25		December fifteenth that the certifications are not on file with the superintendent of	
26		public instruction.	
27	-SECTION	N 7. REPEAL. Sections 15.1-06-18 and 15.1-09-35 of the North Dakota Century	
28	are repealed.		
29	SECTION	N 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY. During the 2015-16 interim, the	
30	legislative ma	anagement shall study provisions of the North Dakota Century Code relating to	
31	education for the purpose of requiring school district superintendents to electronically report		

- 1 required information to the superintendent of public instruction within a specified time period.
- 2 The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any
- 3 legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
