1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 8 of section 25-03.2-01 sections 25-03.2-01,

2 25-03.2-03, 25-03.2-07, and 25-03.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the-

3 definition of a qualified mental health professional psychiatric residential treatment facilities for

4 <u>children and rulemaking authority of the department of human services</u>.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

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7	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15	holds a national certification in psychiatric mental health care registered by the
16	board of nursing; a physician assistant with a mental health certification
17	practicing under the supervision of a psychiatrist; a licensed marriage and family
18	therapist; or an individual who holds a doctorate degree in psychology and is
19	licensed by the board of psychologist examiners; or

21	(1) Who holds at least a master's degree in a mental health field, including
22	psychology, counseling and guidance, nursing, or social work, or who is an
23	advanced practice registered nurse, a physician assistant with a mental
24	health certification, or a physician;

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1		(2) Who holds a state license if practicing in a field covered by a state licensure
2		law; and
3		(3) Who has at least two years of post-degree clinical
4		experience, supervised by another mental health professional, in assessing
5		mental health needs and problems and in providing appropriate mental

7	SEC	CTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 25-03.2-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
8	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:
9	25-0	03.2-01. Definitions.
10	In th	nis chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
11	1.	"Child" or "children" means a person or persons under the age of twenty-one.
12	2.	"Clinical supervision" means the oversight responsibility for individual treatment plans
13		and individual service delivery , provided by qualified mental health professionals .
14	3.	"Department" means the department of human services.
15	4.	"Diagnostic assessment" means a written summary of the history, diagnosis, and
16		individual treatment needs of a mentally ill person using diagnostic, interview, and
17		other relevant assessment techniquesprovided by a mental health professional.
18	5.	"Individual treatment plan" means a written plan of intervention, treatment, and
19		services for a mentally ill person that is developed under the clinical supervision of a
20		mental health professional on the basis of a diagnostic assessment.
21	6.	"Mentally ill person" has the same meaning provided for in section 25-03.1-02.
22	7.	"Psychiatric residential treatment facility for children" means a facility or a distinct part
23		of a facility that provides to children a total, twenty-four hour, therapeutic environment
24		integrating group living, educational services, and a clinical program based upon a
25		comprehensive, interdisciplinary clinical assessment, and an individualized treatment
26		plan that meets the needs of the child and family. The services are available to
27		children in need of and able to respond to active psychotherapeutic intervention and
28		who cannot be effectively treated in their own family, in another home, or in a less
29		restrictive setting. The facility must meet the requirements of a psychiatric residential
30		treatment facility as set out in title 42, Code of Federal Regulations, part 483.352.

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1	8.	"Qualified mental health professional" means a licensed physician who is a
2		psychiatrist, a licensed clinical psychologist who is qualified for listing on the national
3		register of health service providers in psychology, a licensed certified social worker-
4		who is a board-certified diplomate in clinical social work, or a nurse who holds-
5		advanced licensure in psychiatric nursing.
6	9 .	-"Residential treatment" means a twenty-four hour a day program under the clinical
7		supervision of a mental health professional, in a community residential setting other
8		than an acute care hospital, for the active treatment of mentally ill persons.
9	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 25-03.2-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
11	25-0	03.2-03. Requirements for license.
12	The	department shall issue a license for the operation of a psychiatric residential treatment
13	facility fo	or children upon a showing that:
14	1.	The premises to be used are in fit, safe, and sanitary condition and properly equipped
15		to provide good care and treatment;
16	2.	The program director of the facility holds, at a minimum, a master's degree in social
17		work, psychology, or in a related field with at least two years of professional
18		experience in the treatment of children suffering from mental illnesses or emotional
19		disturbances. The executive director of the facility must have, at a minimum, a
20		bachelor's degree in a behavioral science or a bachelor's degree in any field and two
21		years of experience in administration;
22	3.	The staff employed by the facility is supervised by the program director and qualified
23		by training and experience to provide services to children suffering from mental
24		illnesses or emotional disturbances. The facility annually must provide training to staff
25		which is relevant to the needs of the client population;
26	4.	The health, safety, and well-being of the children cared for and treated in the facility
27		will be properly safeguarded;
28	5.	There are sufficient treatment, educational, recreational and leisure, and physical
29		facilities and services available to the children in the facility;
30	6.	The facility will provide for a medical and psychological examination of each child
31		within seventy-two hours of admission and thereafter as needed by the child;

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1	7.	An interdisciplinary team consisting of at least one qualified mental health professional		
2		will review each individual treatment plan at least monthly and update or amend the		
3		plan to meet the needs of the child;		
4	8.	The facility develops postdischarge plans and coordinates facility services and related		
5		community services with partial discharge plans with each child's family, school, and		
6		community upon discharge to ensure continuity of care; and		
7	9.	The facility is in compliance with requirements for psychiatric residential treatment		
8		facilities under 42 U.S.C. 1396d [Pub. L. 89-97; 79 Stat. 351] and title 42, Code of		
9		Federal Regulations, part 441, and with this chapter and rules adopted under this		
10		chapter.		
11	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 25-03.2-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
12	amende	d and reenacted as follows:		
13	25-03.2-07. Method of providing service.			
14	A psychiatric residential treatment facility for children shall provide for the development of			
15	an individual treatment plan, based upon a comprehensive interdisciplinary diagnostic			
16	assessment, which includes the role of the family, identifies the goals and objectives of the			
17	therapeutic activities and treatment, provides a schedule for accomplishing the therapeutic			
18	activities and treatment goals and objectives, and identifies the individuals responsible for			
19	providing services, consistent with the individual treatment plan, to children. Clinical supervision			
20	of the individual treatment plan must be accomplished by full-time or part-time employment of or			
21	contracts with qualified mental health professionals as set forth by the department in rules.			
22	Clinical supervision must be documented by the qualified mental health professionals			
23	cosigningin individual treatment plans and by entries in the child's record regarding supervisory			
24	activity.			
25	SEC	CTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 25-03.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
26	amende	d and reenacted as follows:		
27	25-0	03.2-10. Department may adopt rules.		
28	The	department may adopt rules for the conduct of psychiatric residential treatment facilities		
29	for child	ren and shall adopt rules defining which professionals may provide clinical supervision		
30	and revi	ew, and may develop, update, and sign an individual treatment plan within a psychiatric		
31	resident	ial treatment -facility for children.
