A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 6-09 of the North Dakota Century

Code, relating to the allocation of resources at the time of a child's birth; to provide legislative

intent; and to provide an effective date. for an Act to provide for a legislative management study

regarding the allocation and investment of specific dollars per child at the time of the child's

birth.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 6-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 8 and enacted as follows: 9 Allocation at birth - Permitted uses. 10 At the time of an eligible individual's birth, the Bank of North Dakota shall allocate 11 five thousand dollars and administer and manage that amount for the benefit of 12 the individual, in accordance with this section. 13 For purposes of this section, an "eligible individual" is one whose father and 14 mother, at the time of the individual's birth, are residents of this state and United-15 States citizens. 16 The Bank of North Dakota shall continue to administer and manage the amount 17 allocated on behalf of an eligible individual until such time as the Bank is notified that 18 the allocation is to be released because the individual has enrolled in an institution of 19 higher education under the control of the state board of higher education, at which 20 time the individual's allocation must be forwarded to the institution and credited to the 21 account of the individual. An individual is not eligible to receive a North Dakota 22 academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical education scholarship in

accordance with chapter 15.1-21, if the individual's allocation is released under this

- 3. If before an eligible individual's twentieth birthday, the individual does not enroll in an institution of higher education under the control of the state board of higher education, as required for a release of the individual's allocation in accordance with subsection 2, upon reaching the age of twenty, the individual may request that the allocation be released and credited toward the repayment of principal and interest on a loan held by the Bank of North Dakota. For purposes of this subsection, the loan must be the individual's first business loan, farm loan, or home mortgage loan.
- 4. If an individual's allocation is not released in accordance with subsection 2 or 3, the

 Bank of North Dakota shall continue to administer and manage the allocation on

 behalf of the eligible individual until such time as the Bank is notified that the individual

 has entered a nursing home in this state, at which time the individual's allocation must

 be forwarded to the nursing home and credited to the account of the individual.
- 5. If an individual's allocation is not released in accordance with subsection 2, 3, or 4, the Bank of North Dakota shall return the allocation, together with all interest earned thereon, to the general fund in the state treasury.
 - 6. The Bank of North Dakota may subtract administrative fees from any allocations that it administers and manages in accordance with this section.
- 7. If an individual is convicted of a felony, any amount unallocated at the time of the conviction, together with all interest earned thereon, must be returned by the Bank of North Dakota to the general fund in the state treasury.
- SECTION 2. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the Legislative Assembly that in any litigation involving this Act, the Constitution of North Dakota must be interpreted so as to recognize the right of this state to directly or indirectly assist its eligible residents in educational, agricultural, business, and healthcare pursuits.
 - SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2017.

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - ALLOCATION AND INVESTMENT OF DOLLARS PER CHILD. The legislative management shall consider studying, during the 2015-16 interim, the desirability and feasibility of allocating a specific dollar amount to each resident child at the time of the child's birth and investing that sum so that the child, upon entering an institution of higher education, could have access to substantial resources for scholarships or in the alternative, could have access to resources for the initiation of a business,

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- 1 for the purchase of a home, or for the purchase of farm or ranchland. The legislative
- 2 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation
- 3 required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
