A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-15.4-01, 43-29-01.1, and 43-29-15 of the

North Dakota Century Code, relating to the veterinarian-client-patient relationship; and to

provide for a legislative management study for an Act to provide for a legislative management

study regarding the practice of veterinary medicine in this state.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-15.4-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows: 8 43-15.4-01. Definitions. 9 As used in this chapter: 10 "Board" means the state board of pharmacy. 11 "Compound" means the preparation, mixing, assembling, packaging, or labeling of a 12 drug or device. 13 "Controlled substance" means a drug, substance, or immediate precursor in-14 schedules I through V as set out in chapter 19-03. 15 "Dispensing" means the delivery of a veterinary prescription drug pursuant to the 16 lawful order of a licensed veterinarian and the associated recordkeeping that is-17 relevant to that practice. 18 "Extra-label use" means the use of an approved drug in a manner that is not in-19 accordance with the approved label directions. 20 "Nontraditional livestock" means any wildlife held in a cage, fence, enclosure, or other-21 manmade means of confinement that limits its movement within definite boundaries or 22 an animal that is physically altered to limit movement and facilitate capture. 23 "Veterinary prescription drugs" means drugs that are to be used or prescribed only-24 within the context of a valid veterinarian-client-patient relationship. Veterinary

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1 "Accredited program in veterinary technology" means any postsecondary educational 2 program of two or more academic years that is accredited by the committee on-3 veterinary technician education and activities of the American veterinary medical-4 association. 5 "Animal" means any animal other than a human being. The term includes any 6 mammal, bird, fish, reptile, or fowl, whether wild or domestic, living or dead. 7 "Board" means the board of veterinary medical examiners. 8 "Certificate" means a certificate issued by the educational commission for foreign-9 veterinary graduates or the educational equivalence program of the American-10 association of veterinary state boards, indicating the holder has demonstrated 11 knowledge and skill equivalent to that possessed by a graduate of an accredited-12 college of veterinary medicine. 13 "Licensed veterinarian" means a person who is licensed by the board to practice 14 veterinary medicine. 15 "Licensed veterinary technician" means a person who has graduated from an-16 accredited program in veterinary technology or an equivalent program as determined-17 by the board, and who has passed an examination prescribed by the board. 18 "Practice of veterinary medicine" means to: 19 Diagnose, treat, correct, change, relieve, or prevent animal disease, deformity, 20 defect, injury, or other physical or mental conditions. The term includes the 21 prescription or administration of any drug, medicine, biologic, apparatus, 22 application, anesthetic, or other therapeutic or diagnostic substance or technique, 23 the use of any manual or mechanical procedure for testing for pregnancy, or for-24 correcting sterility or infertility, or to render advice or recommendation with regard-25 to any of the above. 26 Represent, directly or indirectly, publicly or privately, an ability and willingness to-27 do an act described in subdivision a. 28 Use any title, word, abbreviation, or letter in a manner or under circumstances 29 that induce the belief the person using the title, word, abbreviation, or letter is-30 qualified to do any act described in subdivision a.

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - PRACTICE OF VETERINARY

MEDICINE. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the practice of veterinary medicine in this state, including any statutory and regulatory requirements and limitations, and the appropriateness of such requirements and limitations with respect to small animal, large animal, and research-focused practices. The study, if conducted, may include a review of the state board of veterinary medical examiners, including the board's membership, powers, duties, and governance of the practice. The study may also include recommended changes to applicable laws that are irrelevant, inconsistent, illogically arranged, or unclear in their intent and direction. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
