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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 37-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows: Indian veteran representative. The department of veterans' affairs shall provide for an Indian veteran representative in the county in which the most enrolled members of a particular tribe reside. The representative shallbe acquainted with the state and federal laws enacted for the benefit of returning members of the armed forces to assist the members in the presentation, proof and establishment of claims, privileges, and rights the members have under law. The representative shall provide the services at no charge. The veterans' service officer in that county shall cooperate with the representative in providing assistance to veterans in that county applying for state and federal assistance available to veterans. The representative may not serve as a conservator for an individual who is receiving benefits or services from the department of veterans' affairs or the United states department of veterans' affairs, unless the individual is the spouse or animmediate family member of the representative or unless the conservator is appointed by the county under chapter 11-21. SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the generalfund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$125,000, or so much of the

sum as may be necessary, to the department of veterans' affairs for the purpose of providing an-

Indian veteran representative for each tribe in this state, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

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SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - INDIAN VETERANS' SERVICE REPRESENTATIVES STUDY. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the feasibility and desirability of funding Indian veterans' service representatives to provide equivalent services to those provided by county veterans' service officers. The study must include an evaluation of the number of Indian veterans in each county and where the Indian veterans' service representatives should be located. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
