1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 16.1-05 of the North Dakota-

- 2 Century Code, relating to forms of voter identification; and to amend and reenact
- 3 section 16.1-05-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility to vote. for an Act to
- 4 provide for a legislative management study relating to verification of citizenship status for voting
- 5 and for obtaining driver's licenses and nondriver photo identification cards.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

13	residential address and date of birth. <u>A poll clerk may not issue a ballot to an</u>

16	a. A driver's license or nondriver identification card issued by the department of
17	transportation or other official form of identification issued by the state;

15	 <u>Voter identification - Citizenship status on acceptable forms of identification.</u>
16	
17	identification to verify eligibility to vote under section 16.1-05-07 must be prominently
18	marked "non-U.S. citizen" if the individual issued the identification is not a citizen of
19	the United States. The "non-U.S. citizen" designation must replace any other
20	designation that has been used to indicate that an individual is not a citizen of the
21	United States.
22	<u>2. The secretary of state shall ensure that any entity that issues an alternative form of</u>
23	identification approved by the secretary of state as an approved form of identification
24	to verify eligibility to vote under section 16.1-05-07 verifies that any individual seeking
25	the alternative form of identification is a citizen of the United States before the entity
26	issues the identification. The secretary of state shall ensure the issuing entity marks
27	any approved form of identification in a prominent and permanent manner "non-U.S.
28	citizen" if the individual who is otherwise eligible to receive the form of identification is
29	not a citizen of the United States.
30	<u> 3. The marking of a form of identification "non-U.S. citizen" as provided in this</u>
31	section may not be construed as a sanction to deny the individual any right, privilege,

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1	or entitlement the individual otherwise would possess regardless of the individual's
2	citizenship status.
3	SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - VERIFICATION OF CITIZENSHIP
4	STATUS FOR VOTING AND FOR OBTAINING DRIVER'S LICENSES AND NONDRIVER
5	IDENTIFICATION CARDS. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall
6	consider studying issues relating to verification of citizenship status for the purpose of voting,
7	including absentee and mail ballot voting. The study also must address the process through
8	which the department of transportation verifies citizenship status in the issuance of driver's
9	licenses and nondriver identification cards and the feasibility and desirability of requiring the
10	department of transportation to include on a driver's license or nondriver identification card of a
11	noncitizen a notation indicating the individual is not a citizen of the United States. The legislative
12	management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation
13	required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
