- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to lifetime hunting licenses; and to provide for a legislative management
- 3 study.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

## 7 Resident small game lifetime license - Special fund.

- 8 <u>1.</u> The director shall issue a small game lifetime license to a qualified resident as
- 9 provided in this section. The license is not refundable and not transferable. The
- 10 <u>license exempts the resident from yearly fees for the resident certificate, the habitat</u>
- 11 restoration stamp, and the small game license; however, the resident must apply on
- 12 an annual basis. A qualified resident is an individual who at the the time of application
- 13 has been a resident of this state for one year or is a minor child of a person who has
- 14 been a resident of this state for one year. If a qualified resident becomes a
- 15 nonresident, the license is valid for that individual as a nonresident, but all other
- 16 <u>licenses must be obtained on a nonresident basis. The fee for a lifetime resident</u>
- 17 <u>license is:</u>
- 18 <u>a.</u> <u>One hundred sixty dollars for applicants under four years of age.</u>
- 19b.Two hundred seventy five dollars for applicants over three years of age and20under sixteen years of age.
- 21c.Four hundred dollars for applicants over fifteen years of age and under fifty years22of age.
- 23 <u>d.</u> <u>One hundred ninety dollars for applicants over fifty years of age.</u>

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- <u>2.</u> Moneys collected under this section must be placed in a special lifetime license fund in
   <u>the state treasury.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. LIFETIME HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSES LEGISLATIVE
- 4 **MANAGEMENT STUDY.** During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall consider
- 5 studying the feasibility and desirability of game and fish department offering lifetime licenses to
- 6 residents and nonresidents for fishing and hunting, including furbearer and combination
- 7 licenses. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together
- 8 with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative
- 9 assembly.
