1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to study the impact to North 2 Dakotans of the marriage penalty within the supplementary supplemental security income 3 program and the impact of the marriage penalty on retirement benefits under the Social Security 4 Act and encouraging the North Dakota Congressional Delegation to address this issuethe 5 impact within the Social Security laws. 6 WHEREAS, supplementary supplemental security income rescues from poverty over 7,650 7 low-income peopleindividuals with disabilities in North Dakota from povertythis state; and 8 WHEREAS, many older residents depend on social security benefits for retirement income; 9 <u>and</u> 10 WHEREAS, the income of a recipient's spouse is considered in calculating the benefits for 11 thea recipient; and 12 **WHEREAS**, benefits for a married couple, both of whom receive 13 supplementarysupplemental security income benefits and have no other income, are 25 percent 14 less than the total they would receive if they were living together but not as husband and wife 15 which provides,; and 16 WHEREAS, social security benefits may be reduced for married couples; and 17 WHEREAS, such circumstances provide a financial incentive for some people retired 18 individuals and individuals with disabilities to forgo marriage; and 19 WHEREAS, North Dakotathis state supports family values and the sanctity of marriage; and 20 WHEREAS, an examination should be made of the impact of the marriage penalty has 21 within the supplementary supplemental security income program and the social security 22 program; the number of residents affected, by the marriage penalty; the impact of the marriage 23 penalty on housing affordability; the ability of married recipients in this state to meet the cost-24 oftheir basic needs for North Dakota residents, assessing, whether the marriage penalty holds 25 married recipients are held below the poverty level in North Dakota, this state; and policies in
