## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1015**

(At the request of the Governor)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 corrections and rehabilitation; to provide an appropriation to the legislative council; to provide
- 3 for a legislative management study; to provide for a prison bed day allocations pilot project; and
- 4 to provide legislative intent.

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## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department of corrections and rehabilitation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, as follows:

14	appropriations committees of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time			
15	funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.			
16	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL. There is appropriated out of			
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**SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$50,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the legislative council for the purpose of obtaining consulting services to assist with a legislative management study of incarceration issues, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.

**SECTION 4. RECIDIVISM REDUCTION REENTRY PROGRAM - PILOT PROJECT.** The adult services line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$1,300,000 from the general fund for the recidivism reduction reentry program pilot project in Cass, Burleigh, Morton, and Williams Counties.

SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - INCARCERATION ISSUES. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall study the recidivism reduction reentry program pilot project, the prison day bed allocation pilot project, pretrial services, sentencing alternatives, treatment options, and other related issues. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly. To conduct the study, legislative management shall create an incarceration issues committee consisting of:

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1 Two members of the house appropriations committee; 2 2. Two members of the senate appropriations committee; 3 3. One member of the house judiciary committee; 4 4. One member of the senate judiciary committee; and 5 5. Other members serving in a nonvoting advisory capacity include: 6 a. Two district court judges appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court; 7 b. The chief justice of the state supreme court, or a designee of the chief justice; 8 One local law enforcement official appointed by the governor from a city with a C. 9 population greater than 10,000, based on the most recent decennial census; 10 d. One local law enforcement official appointed by the governor from a city with a 11 population less than 10,000, based on the most recent decennial census; 12 One state's attorney appointed by the attorney general from a county with a e. 13 population of 10,000 or more, based on the most recent decennial census; 14 One state's attorney appointed by the attorney general from a county with a 15 population of less than 10,000, based on the most recent decennial census; 16 The attorney general, or a designee of the attorney general; g. 17 h. The director of the department of corrections and rehabilitation; and 18 İ. One member appointed by the director of the department of corrections and 19 rehabilitation. 20 Legislative management shall select the chairman and vice chairman of the committee. The 21 committee shall meet quarterly, at the times and places as determined by the chairman. The 22 legislative council shall provide staff services for the committee. 23 SECTION 6. PRISON BED DAY ALLOCATION - PILOT PROJECT. The department of 24 corrections and rehabilitation shall allocate to Cass, Burleigh, Morton, and Williams Counties a 25 specific number of prison bed days available for offenders from each county for the 2015-17 26 biennium. The department shall provide each county with its allocation before July 1, 2015. The 27 department shall determine the specific number of prison bed days available to each county by 28 considering the estimated 2015-17 biennium inmate population at the department, the 29 authorized legislative appropriation for housing inmates in correctional facilities, including

county census data, as reported by the United States Census Bureau. For the purposes of this

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1 section, the department shall exclude all inmates sentenced to more than seven years and 2 inmates whose parole or probation has been revoked. The department shall provide each 3 county with a monthly statement reporting the number of prison bed days used during the 4 biennium to date by that county and the county's current balance of available prison bed days. If 5 a county exceeds its 2015-17 biennium prison bed day allocation, the department shall bill the 6 county seventy dollars for each prison bed day in excess of the county's 2015-17 biennium 7 prison bed day allocation. If a county does not exceed its 2015-17 biennium prison bed day 8 allocation, the county shall be eligible to receive a proportionate amount of the unspent 9 legislative appropriation designated for housing inmates in out-of-state correctional facilities. 10 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - CONTRACT HOUSING AND PROGRAMMING. It is 11 the intent of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly that the department of corrections and 12 rehabilitation give priority for the use of funding appropriated for contract housing and 13 programming to contract with in-state local and regional facilities for the placement of overflow 14 inmates for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
