1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 commerce; to provide exemptions; to provide for transfers; to amend and reenact section-

3 54-60-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to internships, apprenticeships, and work-

4 experience opportunities; and to declare an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 7 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 8 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 9 other income, to the department of commerce for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 10 department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, 11 as follows:

2017-19 biennium. The department of commerce shall report to the appropriations committees
of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium
beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
SECTION 3. GRANT - WORKPLACE SAFETY FACILITY. The grants line item in section 1


of this Act includes the sum of \$2,000,000 from the general fund for providing a grant to an
 organization that provides workplace safety <u>training</u> for the purpose of <u>constructing a workplace</u>
 safety training facilityacquiring land, site development, and design for a workplace safety
 training facility, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
 SECTION 4. SPECIAL NEEDS ATHLETIC ORGANIZATION GRANT. The grants line item

- 27 in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$2,000,000 from the general fund for a grant to an
- 28 organization that provides training and competition to athletes with special needs to be
- 29 administered by the department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and
- 30 ending June 30, 2017. Grants are available for costs associated with promoting and hosting a

1 national competition for athletes with special needs, contingent upon a North Dakota site being-2 selected to host a national competition for athletes with special needs. 3 SECTION 4. BASE RETENTION GRANT PROGRAM. The grants line item in section 1 of 4 this Act includes the sum of \$1,500,000 from the general fund for a base retention grant 5 program to be developed by the department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 6 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The grant program must award direct grants and not cost 7 reimbursement grants. The department may award grants of up to \$500,000 to each community 8 with an air force base or air national guard facilities. 9 SECTION 5. STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - ENHANCED 10 **USE LEASE GRANT PROGRAM.** The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum 11 of \$5,000,000\$2,500,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund for an 12 enhanced use lease grant program to be developed by the department of commerce, for the 13 biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. Grants are available for 14 constructing infrastructure required for an enhanced use lease private sector business 15 development project located on or adjacent to the Grand Forks air force base. The department 16 may award \$2,500,000 funds for taxi-way reconnection and alert pad refurbishment after an 17 agreement is reached and construction commences for a second the first private sector 18 single-tenant or multitenant building on the property. The remaining \$2,500,000 Funds may also 19 be awarded either after an agreement is reached and construction commences for a second 20 private sector single-tenant or multitenant building on the property or after an agreement is 21 reached with any data centerintensive tenant for data connectivity and redundancy 22 infrastructure requirements, such as fiber. The department of commerce shall establish 23 accountability requirements for grants awarded under this section. 24 SECTION 6. CHILD CARE FACILITY GRANT PROGRAM. The grants line item in 25 section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$3,000,000\$1,875,000 from the general fund for a child 26 care facility grant program to be developed by the department of commerce, for the biennium 27 beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The department shall establish guidelines to 28 qualify for a grant under this section which must include a matching requirement one dollar of 29 matching funds for every three dollars of grant funds and a maximum grant amount of 30 \$187,500.

1 SECTION 7. ENTREPRENEURSHIP GRANTS AND VOUCHER PROGRAM __ 2 **EXEMPTION.** Section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$2,500,000, of which \$2,350,000 is from 3 the general fund and \$150,000 from special funds, for an entrepreneurship grants and voucher 4 program to be developed and administered by the department of commerce, for the biennium 5 beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The department shall establish guidelines to 6 provide grants to entrepreneurial centers certified by the department. The department shall use 7 up to \$300,000 to provide a grant to a nonprofit organization entrepreneurial center assisting 8 individuals with business ideas located in the city where the state capitol is located. The 9 department also shall establish guidelines to award vouchers to entrepreneurs to procure 10 business development assistance from certified entrepreneurial centers or to provide grants to 11 entrepreneurs working with an entrepreneurial center. The amount appropriated for 12 entrepreneurship grants in section 1 of this Act is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any 13 unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, 14 and ending June 30, 2019. 15 SECTION 8. UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS PROGRAM. The grants line item in 16 section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$2,718,620 from the general fund for operations of the 17 unmanned aircraft systems test site. Of the amount appropriated, \$1,200,000 may only be used 18 as matching funds to incentivize private sector business development related to the test site. 19 Matching funds provided under this section are not a business incentive under chapter 54-60.1. 20 SECTION 10. EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM. The 21 grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$6,000,000 from the general fund for 22 an early childhood education community grant program to be developed by the department of 23 public instruction and the department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, 24 and ending June 30, 2017. Effective July 1, 2016, community grants of \$1,000 may be made-25 available to providers of four-year-old prekindergarten education which meet the following-26 requirements: 27 1. The licensed program follows the state's pre-kindergarten standards and 28 accountability. 29 2. The instruction is taught by a teacher licensed in North Dakota with a credential in-30 pre-kindergarten or kindergarten.

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30 item in section 1 of this Act to the internship fund for the purpose of administering the operation

1 intern program, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30,

2 2017.

SECTION 14. TRANSFER - RESEARCH NORTH DAKOTA FUND. The office of
 management and budget shall transfer the amount appropriated in the research North Dakota
 line item in section 1 of this Act to the research North Dakota fund for the purpose of
 implementing and administering the research North Dakota grant program, for the biennium
 beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
 SECTION 15. TRANSFER - CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE FUND. After the close of the

9 biennium ending June 30, 2015, the office of management and budget shall transfer any
10 unobligated funds remaining in the centers of excellence fund to the research North Dakota
11 fund.

SECTION 16. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the agricultural products
 utilization commission in section 1 of chapter 49 of the 2013 Session Laws is not subject to
 section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this line item for grants are available for
 grants during the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.

SECTION 17. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the discretionary funds line item
 in section 1 of chapter 49 of the 2013 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any
 unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2015,
 and ending June 30, 2017.

SECTION 18. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the technology-based
entrepreneurship grant program contained in the grants line item in section 1 of chapter 49 of
the 2013 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from
this line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30,
2017.

SECTION 19. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the child care facility grants in
 section 14 of chapter 45 of the 2013 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any
 unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2015,
 and ending June 30, 2017.

SECTION 20. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the unmanned aircraft systems
 program in section 1 of chapter 49 of the 2013 Session Laws is not subject to section

- 1 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium
- 2 beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.

SECTION 21. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the tribal college grants in
section 6 of chapter 437 of the 2013 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any
unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2015,
and ending June 30, 2017.

7 SECTION 23. AMENDMENT. Section 54-60-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 54-60-17. Division of workforce development - Internships, apprenticeships, and work 10 experience opportunities.

11 The division of workforce development shall administer a program to increase use of 12 internships, apprenticeships, and work experience opportunities for higher education students-13 and, high school students enrolled in grade eleven or twelve, and educators. The primary focus-14 of this program must be higher education internships in target industries. This program shall-15 provide services to employers, communities, and business organizations to increase internship, 16 apprenticeship, and work experience opportunities. The department shall maintain records of 17 the number of internship, apprenticeship, and work experience opportunities subsidized within-18 each funding recipient.

SECTION 22. EXEMPTION. Any amount continued pursuant to section 27 of chapter 49 of
the 2013 Session Laws, relating to the antiballistic missile site acquisition grant and base
realignment grant, that is unexpended as of June 30, 2015, up to \$600,000, is not subject to
section 54-44.1-11 and is available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending
June 30, 2017. The department of commerce may use funds only for the purpose awarding a
grant to assist in the acquisition and development of the antiballistic missile site at the
Stanley R. Mickelson safeguard complex in Nekoma.

SECTION 23. EMERGENCY. Funding of \$1,550,000\$1,500,000 in the operating expenses
 line item in section 1, and section 10 of this Act, relating to the operation intern program, are
 declared to be an emergency measure.
