FIRST ENGROSSMENT with House Amendments ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2015

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the various divisions 2 under the supervision of the director of the office of management and budget; to provide an 3 appropriation to the department of transportation; to provide an appropriation to the state 4 auditor; to provide an appropriation to the legislative assembly; to amend and reenact 5 subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 15-10-17 and section 48-08-04 of the North Dakota 6 Century Code, relating to North Dakota university system personnel and the use of legislative 7 meeting rooms; to repeal section 54-44-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to duties 8 of the office of management and budget as to school fund; to provide an exemption; to provide 9 for various transfers; to provide for a legislative management study; to provide a statement of 10 legislative intent; and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the office of management and budget for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, as follows:

APPROPRIATION - LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY - MEETING ROOMS -4 REPORTS TO LEGISLATIVE PROCEDURE AND ARRANGEMENTS COMMITTEE. There is 5 appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise 6 appropriated, the sum of \$160,000 or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the 7 legislative assembly for the purpose of purchasing and installing audio and visual equipment, 8 tables, chairs, and other furnishings in legislative meeting rooms within the facility space 9 expansion authorized under House Bill No. 1002, as approved by the sixty-fourth legislative 10 assembly, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The funding 11 appropriated in this section is considered a one-time funding item. 12 The state court administrator shall provide periodic reports to the legislative procedure and 13 arrangements committee during the 2015-16 interim regarding the status of the facility space 14 expansion authorized under House Bill No. 1002, as approved by the sixty-fourth legislative 15 assembly. 16 SECTION 8. ESTIMATED INCOME - CAPITOL BUILDING FUND. The estimated income 17 line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$1,710,000 from the capitol building fund, of which 18 \$1,400,000 is for capitol building entrance and signage projects and \$310,000 is for legislative 19 wing electrical and ceiling repairs. 20 **SECTION 9. COMMUNITY SERVICE SUPERVISION GRANTS - FUNDING** 21 **ALLOCATIONS - ADDITIONAL INCOME APPROPRIATION.** The grants line item in section 1 22 of this Act includes the sum of \$500,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing 23 community service supervision grants. The office of management and budget shall distribute the 24 grant funds on or before August first during each year of the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, 25 and ending June 30, 2017, to North Dakota community corrections association regions as 26 follows: 27 **Barnes County** \$12,121 28 27,057 Bismarck (urban) 29 Bismarck (rural) 14,223 30 **Devils Lake** 14,329

26	SECTION 12. STATE STUDENT INTERNSHIP PROGRAM. The human resource	es division
27	of the office of management and budget may transfer to each eligible agency approp	riated

30	SECTION 13. OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET - TEMPORARY EMP	LOYEE
31	HEALTH INSURANCE POOL. The office of management and budget may transfer to	each

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increase for each employee.

- 1 eligible agency appropriation authority from the health insurance pool - temporary employees 2 line item contained in section 1 of this Act. Transfers may be made for the purpose of providing 3 temporary employee health insurance adjustments for state employees, including institutions of 4 higher education, determined to be full time based on guidelines developed by the office of 5 management and budget in accordance with the shared responsibility provisions of the 6 Affordable Care Act for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. 7 **SECTION 14. FUNDING TRANSFERS - EXCEPTION - AUTHORIZATION.** 8 Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, agencies may transfer appropriation authority between line 9 items, as it relates to compensation increases authorized in section 15 of this Act, for the 10 biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The agencies shall notify the office 11 of management and budget of any transfer made pursuant to this section. 12 SECTION 15. STATE EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION ADJUSTMENTS - GUIDELINES. It is 13 the intent of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly that 2015-17 biennium compensation 14 adjustments for classified state employees for each year of the biennium are to be a 15 performance component in a range of two to four percent based on documented performance. 16 Increases for classified state employees are not to be the same percentage increase for each 17 employee. The increases for the first year of the biennium are to be given beginning with the 18 month of July 2015, to be paid in August 2015, and for the second year of the biennium are to 19 be given beginning with the month of July 2016, to be paid in August 2016. 20 Probationary employees are not entitled to the performance increases. However, 21 probationary employees may be given all or a portion of the increases effective in July, paid in 22 August, or upon completion of probation, at the discretion of the appointing authority. 23 The office of management and budget shall develop guidelines for use by state agencies for 24 providing compensation adjustments for regular classified employees. The guidelines must 25 follow section 54-44.3-01.2, compensation philosophy statement. 26 Compensation adjustments for regular nonclassified state employees, excluding employees 27 under the control of the state board of higher education, are to be in a range of two to four 28 percent based on market and documented performance and are not to be the same percentage
 - Employees whose overall documented performance level does not meet standards are not eligible for any salary increase.

1 SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 15-10-17 of the North 2 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 3 Appoint and remove all university system office personnel, fix their salaries within 4 the limits of legislative appropriations, fix their terms of office, and prescribe their 5 duties. The board shall adopt a policy that provides that each vice chancellor in 6 the university system office is considered to have resigned the individual's 7 position as a vice chancellor upon the appointment of a commissioner of higher 8 education. 9 SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 48-08-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 10 amended and reenacted as follows: 11 48-08-04. Use of legislative assembly rooms and halls. 12 During the interim between legislative sessions, the committee rooms, halls, passageways, 13 and other space in the capitol used by the legislative assembly, including the pioneer room and 14 three additional meeting rooms comprising approximately four thousand square feet in the 15 judicial wing of the capitol, may not be used without authorization of the legislative council. 16 **SECTION 18. REPEAL.** Section 54-44-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed. 17 SECTION 19. ONE-TIME FUNDING - ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES. The funding 18 appropriated to the department of human services in Senate Bill No. 2289 as approved by the 19 sixty-fourth legislative assembly, relating to assistive technology services is considered one-time 20 funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. 21 SECTION 20. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - BUDGET SECTION FUNCTIONS. 22 During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall study the functions of the budget 23 section. The study must review the duties and studies assigned to the budget section and the 24 ability of the budget section to authorize financial decisions, including full-time equivalent 25 positions, university system building projects, and project scope changes. The legislative 26 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation 27 necessary to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly. 28 SECTION 21. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - STATE BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION -29 **SEVERANCE PAY.** Notwithstanding any policy adopted by the board, the state board of higher 30 education or an institution under its control may not approve or provide severance pay to any 31 employee whose employment is terminated as a result of the transfer of positions from the state

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- 1 board of higher education to the attorney general as provided in House Bill No. 1003 as
- 2 approved by the sixty-fourth legislative assembly.
- 3 **SECTION 22. EMERGENCY.** Section 16 of this Act is declared to be an emergency
- 4 measure.
