- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for collaboration between the school for the deaf and school
- 2 districts on the provision of appropriate services and resources to children who are deaf or
- 3 hearing impaired and the families of children who are deaf or hearing impaired.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. COLLABORATION BETWEEN SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF AND SCHOOL

6 DISTRICTS TO PROVIDE SERVICES AND RESOURCES TO CHILDREN WHO ARE DEAF 7 OR HEARING IMPAIRED.

- The school for the deaf shall collaborate with school districts to ensure that children
 who are deaf or hearing impaired and families of children who are deaf or hearing
 impaired receive appropriate services and have access to appropriate resources
 including:
- a. Screening and assessment of hearing capabilities and communication and
 language needs at the earliest possible age, and continuation of screening
 services throughout the child's educational experience;
- b. Early intervention to provide for acquisition of solid language bases at the earliest
 age possible;
- 17 c. The opportunity to interact in person or through technological mediums with adult
 18 role models and peers who are deaf or hearing impaired;
- 19d.Qualified teachers, interpreters, and resource personnel, who communicate20effectively with the child in the child's mode of communication; and
- e. Placement best suited to the child's needs such as social, emotional, cultural,
 age-related, hearing loss, academic level, mode of communication, style of
 learning, motivational level, and family support needs.

a. Make information available to parents of children who are deaf or hearing
 impaired; and
 b. Provide awareness information to the public concerning medical, cultural, and
 linguistic issues of deafness and hearing loss.
