REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE ERTELT

MR. SPEAKER: Mr. Speaker, my new hometown of Lisbon, North Dakota, has a strong tradition of wrestling prowess. Prior to 2017, the Lisbon Broncos had amassed 43 individual championships from 1977 to 2014, 3 team individual state championships in 2008, 1983 & 1978, and 1 team dual state championship in 2008. There are 3 North Dakota Wrestling Hall of Fame inductees from Lisbon; they hold 5 Coach of the Year awards; 3 of their individual champions were named Mr. Wrestler; their wrestlers hold 8 individual state wrestling records; and they are 1 of only 8 schools with multiple team individual state championships.

On Friday, February 17th of this year, the Lisbon Broncos wrestling team came one point short of adding another team dual state championship. The following day, however, was another story. Not only did the Lisbon Broncos claim their 4th Class B team individual state wrestling title, but added 3 individual state titles along the way – Ethan Elijah in the 145lb weight class, Jordan Urbach in the 170lb weight class, and Soren McDaniel in the 182lb weight class. The leader of these young men, Head Coach Joe Kern, was awarded Coach of the Year. Elijah, Urbach, and McDaniel all have relatives who were also individual champions for Lisbon and I sincerely hope the tradition continues.

Congratulations to the athletes, coaches, and parents whose sacrifice and dedication has rewarded them with victory; and to the school faculty, staff, and students and the entire community of Lisbon for their overwhelming support of the Broncos wrestling program.

The employer shall pay these employee contributions from the same source of funds used in paying compensation to the employee or from the levy authorized by subsection 5 of section 57-15-28.1. The employer shall pay these contributions by effecting an equal cash reduction in the gross salary of the employee or by an offset against future salary increases or by a contribution of a reduction in gross salary and offset against future salary increases. If employee contributions are paid by the employer, they must be treated for the purposes of this chapter in the same manner and to the same extent as employee contributions made prior to the date on which employee contributions were assumed by the employer. An employer exercising its option under this subsection shall report its choice to the board in writing."
