REMARKS OF SENATOR MATHERN

MR. PRESIDENT AND COLLEAGUGES OF THE SENATE: Today marks a special day not only for people around the world, but for this body itself.

In 1991 a coalition of 6 legislators, Democrat and Republican, introduced Senate Bill 2489 which established Martin Luther King Day as a state holiday. Two sponsors still serve in the Senate today.

Though Dr. King was assassinated in 1968, he left a legacy of people embracing his philosophy and strategy of nonviolence to eliminate poverty, racism and war. He did this not by staying in the seminary or only preaching on Sunday. No, it was turning words into action that made the difference. Dr. King got involved in the nitty gritty lives of people around him.

Each of you in this chamber do the same; you know about needs in your district; you come here to make a positive difference.

We recognize Dr. King did more than most of us; he marched, he protested, and he was jailed numerous times. With his church, he challenged his city, state, country, and president always in a non-violent manner. He did this all in the cause of justice.

Let us reflect today with confidence that we sometimes do the same as did Dr. King. Let us exercise the dream by acting on it by promoting justice in our day.

REMARKS OF SENATOR DEVER

MR. PRESIDENT: Eighty-eight years ago yesterday, on the 15th of January, 1929, Michael King Jr. was born, the son of Michael King Sr. and Alberta Williams King. In 1934, when young Michael was 5 years old, his father traveled to Germany to attend the Fifth Baptist World Alliance Congress in Berlin. His father was exposed to the works of Martin Luther who was a non-violent leader of the reformation 500 years ago. In honor of Martin Luther, the elder King adopted the names Martin Luther King for both himself and his son.

Following the example of his namesake, King dedicated his life to reform through non-violent means, in his case on the issue of Civil Rights. He was involved in several marches and protests, often at personal risk to himself, and always in a peaceful manner.

His greatest strength was his powerful, and inspirational, oratory. We all recall his "I have a dream" speech. He said, "I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character." He advanced his dream, and we have made a lot of progress with room yet to improve.

Martin Luther King, Jr. fell to an assassin's bullet on the 4th of April, 1968. Like other significant events, I can remember where I was when I first heard the news. He was 39 years old. He had accomplished more in his life for Civil Rights than others have in longer lives by other means. As we honor his memory, we look to this day as a time to follow his example.
