## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1039

Page 1, line 1, after "A BILL" replace the remainder of the bill with "for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 23-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to hospital discharge policies.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 23-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## Hospital discharge policies - Uncompensated caregivers.

- <u>1.</u> <u>As used in this section:</u>
  - a. <u>"Aftercare" means assistance related to a patient's condition at the</u> <u>time of discharge provided by an uncompensated caregiver to a</u> <u>patient after the patient's discharge. The term may include assistance</u> <u>with activities of daily living, instrumental activities of daily living, or</u> <u>medical or nursing tasks.</u>
  - b. "Discharge" means a patient's release from a hospital following the patient's admission to the hospital.
  - c. <u>"Uncompensated caregiver" means an individual who, at the request</u> of a patient, agrees to provide, without compensation, aftercare to the patient in the patient's residence.
- 2. <u>A hospital shall establish and maintain written discharge policies in</u> accordance with the medicare and medicaid conditions of participation. The discharge policies apply to all patients of the hospital, regardless of whether the patient receives medicare or medicaid.
- 3. A patient or a patient's guardian may identify an uncompensated caregiver.
- 4. This section may not be construed to interfere with the rights of an agent operating under a valid health care directive under chapter 23-06.5."
