## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows: 8 Inmate housing construction program. 9 The industrial commission and the department of corrections and rehabilitation shall 10 collaborate to establish a program through which inmates are provided housing-11 construction vocational skills through the construction of homes that are made 12 available for sale to low-income home buyers. 13 The industrial commission: 14 May appoint an advisory board to assist with this program, which may include 15 private and public membership. 16 May offer home purchase financing or loan guarantees through the Bank of North 17 Dakota. 18 May administer the program through the housing finance agency. 19 Shall establish home buyer qualifications, which must include provisions: 20 (1) Setting household income limits. 21 (2) Requiring the program home be used as the home buyer's sole residence. 22 (3) Requiring the program home to be placed within the state. 23 3. The department of corrections and rehabilitation:

- a. May add this program to the program of modified workers' compensation coverage established under chapter 65-06.2.
- b. May employ inmates under this program in accordance with chapter 12-48.

During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall study the creation of an inmate housing construction program to provide inmates with housing construction vocational skills through the construction of homes to be made available for sale to low-income home buyers. The study must include an analysis of the grants available to support the program, the ability to establish partnerships with private industry and apprentice opportunities with labor groups, and the ability to work with private industry to provide for the sale and transport of the completed homes. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.
