- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to professional student exchange programs; to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 43-28.1-01 and 43-28.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the dental
- 4 student loan repayment program; to provide for a legislative management study; and to provide
- 5 for application.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
and enacted as follows:

<u>Professional student exchange programs - Bank of North Dakota - Notes Agreements</u>

Repayment.

- 1. The state board of higher education may not make a payment to an out-of-state institution on behalf of an individual participating in a professional student exchange program in dentistry, optometry, or veterinary medicine, unless that individual signed an annual note with the Bank of North Dakota in an amount equal to a legally binding agreement with the state board of higher education which identifies the amount by which the individual's tuition is reduced as a result of a contract between the institution and the board of the award under the professional student exchange program.
- 2. If the individual who signed the note agreement under subsection 1 is not practicing dentistry, optometry, or veterinary medicine in this state within thirty-six months following graduation or of leaving the education program, the individual shall begin repaying the note, together with interest accruing from the date of signing, at the rate per annum established by the Bank of North Dakotarepay the amount of the agreement in full at that time.

- If the individual who signed the note agreement under subsection 1 practices dentistry, optometry, or veterinary medicine in this state within thirty-six months following graduation, the Bank of North Dakota state board of higher education shall reduce the amount of the noteagreement by one-third, together with all accrued interest, for each full year the individual continues practicing in the state. If the individual stops practicing in this state before the note amount of the agreement is waived in its entirety, from the date that individual stopped such practice the individual shall repay the remaining portion of the note, together with interest accruing at the rate per annum-established by the Bank of North Dakota agreement in full from the date the individual stopped practicing in the state.
 - 4. If the individual who signed the noteagreement under subsection 1 departs before graduation from a program in dentistry, optometry, or veterinary medicine, at the time of departure that individual shall begin repaying the note, together with interest accruing from the date of signing, at the rate per annum established by the Bank of North Dakotarepay the amount of the agreement in full.
 - 5. The Bank of North Dakota shall determine the terms applicable to the time and manner in which a note must be repaidallow an individual who is required to repay all or a portion of an agreement under this section to utilize one of the bank's student loan programs as an option for repayment, up to the amount certified by the state board of higher education. To qualify under this subsection, the individual must meet student loan credit criteria as established by the bank.
 - 6. The Bank of North Dakotastate board of higher education shall defer any repayment of a notean agreement otherwise due under this section for the period of time the individual who signed the noteagreement is pursuing full-time graduate or postdoctoral studies or is called to active duty as a member of the armed forces. The repayment provisions under an agreement signed under this section must provide for cancellation of the repayment requirements if the individual dies or becomes permanently or totally disabled.
 - 7. The state board of higher education shall consult with the Bank of North Dakota and adopt rules implementing this section. The state board of higher education shall report confirm eligibility, to the bank on the student status and practice status, of

3	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-28.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	amended and reenacted as follows:
5	43-28.1-01. Loan repayment program - Dentists - Defined need - Maximum amount of
6	funds.
7	Each year Annually, the state health council shall select, from a pool of applicants, dentists
8	who shallwill provide dental services in cities or surrounding areas, or both, in this state which
9	the state health council identifies as having a defined need for dental services. The dentists
10	selected from this pool of applicants may include dentists who willmust agree to accept
11	medicaid patients and assignments or provide dental services in a public health clinic, a
12	practice with a focus on an underserved population, or a nonprofit dental clinic. The dentists
13	are A selected dentist who agrees to the terms of this program is eligible to receive funds for the
14	repayment of theirthe dentist's education loans. The funds, which are payable over a five-year
15	period, may not exceed one hundred thousand dollars per applicant. If the state health council
16	accepts any gifts, grants, or donations under this chapter, the council may select additional
17	dentists for participation in the loan repayment program under this chapter.
18	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-28.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19	amended and reenacted as follows:
20	43-28.1-03. Criteria.
21	1. The health council shall establish criteria to be used in selecting qualified dentists and
22	in identifying cities or surrounding areas, or both, that have a defined need for dental
23	services. The criteria must include consideration of:
24	a. The number of dentists already providing dental services in the city or
25	surrounding areas, or both;
26	b. Access to dental services in the city and the surrounding areas;
27	c. How the dentist will provide dental services to individuals on medical assistance
28	or in a public health clinic, a practice with a focus on an underserved population,

or a nonprofit dental clinic; and

- d. The dentist's training in general dentistry or in a dental specialty and the extent to which such services are needed in the identified city or surrounding areas, or both.
 - 2. As a term of receipt of funds under this chapter, a dentist shall accept medical assistance patients and assignments or provide dental services in a public health clinic, a practice with a focus on an underserved population, or a nonprofit dental clinic. For purposes of a dentist selected for loan payment under this chapter who practices within fifteen miles [24.14 kilometers] of the city limits of one of the three largest cities in the state, to qualify to receive a yearly disbursement under this chapter during that year of obligated service, the dentist must have:
 - Received dental medical payments of at least twenty thousand dollars in the form of medical assistance reimbursement; or
 - b. Practiced at least two full workdays per week at a public health clinic or at a nonprofit dental clinic that uses a sliding fee schedule to bill the nonprofit dental clinic's patients.
 - 3. The health council may consult with public and private sector entities in establishing criteria and evaluating needs based on the criteria.

SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - PROFESSIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM AND WESTERN INTERSTATE COMMISSION FOR HIGHER EDUCATION. During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying and evaluating the current agreements and participation with the western interstate commission for higher education and the professional student exchange program. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.

SECTION 5. APPLICATION. Section 1 of this Act applies to individuals initially entering a professional student exchange program in dentistry, optometry, or veterinary medicine after June 30, 2018. Sections 2 and 3 of this Act apply to dental loan repayment contracts entered on or after the effective date of this Act.
