- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 43-41-04, sections 43-45-05.1
- 2 and 43-47-06, and subsection 7 of section 43-53-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating

3 to licensure requirements for behavioral health professionals; and to provide for a report to the

4 legislative management.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 43-41-04 of the North Dakota Century
7 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

8	4.	The board shall issue a license as a licensed independent clinical social worker to an
9		applicant who:

- 10 a. Has a doctorate or master's degree in social work from a college or university.
- b. Has passed Passed an examination approved by the board for this purpose.
- 12 Has satisfied Satisfied the board that within a four-year period the applicant has-C. 13 successfully completed three thousand hours of supervised post-master's clinical 14 social work experience. At least one thousand five hundred of the required hours 15 must have been under the supervision of a licensed independent clinical social 16 worker, or, if. Additional hours of supervision may have been under other 17 professionals designated by a supervising licensed independent clinical social 18 worker. However, if an applicant began that supervised post-master's clinical 19 social work experience before August 1, 2009, a licensed certified social worker 20 who has two years of experience, a licensed psychologist with a doctorate
- 21 degree, or a licensed psychiatrist <u>may have supervised the required hours</u>.
- d. Has satisfied<u>Satisfied</u> the board that the applicant agrees to adhere to the code
 of social work ethics adopted by the board.

1	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-45-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
2	amended and reenacted as follows:					
3	43-45-05.1. Initial licenses.					
4	1.	The board shall issue an initial license as an addiction counselor to an applicant who				
5		has met all of the following requirements:				
6		a. Has successfullySuccessfully completed board-approved coursework, approved				
7		by the board, at an accredited college or university.				
8		b. Has successfullySuccessfully completed one or more oral or written				
9		examinations approved by the board for this purpose.				
10		c. Has successfullySuccessfully completed a clinical training program approved by				
11		the board or accumulated experience as established by the board by rule.				
12		d. Has satisfied <u>Satisfied</u> the board that the applicant agrees to adhere to the code				
13		of professional conduct adopted by the board.				
14	2.	For clinical training program or accumulated experience required for initial licensure, at				
15		least fifty percent of required supervision must be provided by a supervising licensed				
16		addiction counselor and the additional supervision may be with other professionals				
17		designated by the supervising addiction counselor and competent in the area of				
18		practice being supervised.				
19	<u>3.</u>	The board may grant reciprocity, on such terms and conditions as it may determine				
20		necessary, to an applicant for licensure who is in good standing as a licensed,				
21		approved, or certified addiction counselor under the laws of another jurisdiction that				
22		imposes at least substantially the same requirements that are imposed under this				
23		chapter.				
24	<u>3.4.</u>	An applicant who is denied If the board denies a licensure must be notified application,				
25		the board shall notify the applicant in writing of the reasons for denial and of the				
26		applicant's right to a hearing before the board, under chapter 28-32, if a hearing is				
27		requested within thirty days.				
28	SEC	TION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-47-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
29	amended and reenacted as follows:					

1	43-47-06. Licenses - Qualifications - Reciprocity.					
2	1.	Exc	cept as otherwise provided in this chapter, noa person may not engage in			
3		cou	nseling in this state unless that person is a licensed professional counselor or			
4		lice	nsed associate professional counselor.			
5	2.	The	e board shall issue a license as a licensed professional counselor to each applicant			
6		who	o files an application upon a form and in a manner the board prescribes,			
7		acc	ompanied by the required fee, and who furnishes evidence to the board that the			
8		арр	applicant:			
9		a.	Has received a master's degree from an accredited school or college in			
10			counseling or other program that meets the academic and training standards			
11			adopted by the board;			
12		b.	Has provided Provided personal and professional recommendations that meet the			
13			requirements adopted by the board and has satisfied the board that the applicant			
14			will adhere to the highest standards of the profession of counseling;			
15		C.	Has two years of supervised experience, at least fifty percent of which must have			
16			been under a licensed professional counselor, or its equivalent as determined by			
17			the board, and the additional supervised experience may have been with other			
18			professionals designated by the supervising licensed professional counselor,			
19			which are competent in the area of practice being supervised;			
20		d.	Has provided Provided a statement of professional intent to practice in this state			
21			describing the applicant's proposed use of the license, the intended client			
22			population, and the counseling procedures, as defined by the board, the			
23			applicant intends to use in serving the client population; and			
24		e.	Has demonstrated knowledge in the field of counseling by successful completion			
25			of an examination prescribed by the board.			
26	3.	The	board shall issue a license as a licensed associate professional counselor to each			
27		арр	licant who files an application upon a form and in a manner the board prescribes,			
28		acc	ompanied by the required fee, and who furnishes sufficient evidence to the board			
29		that	t the applicant:			

1		a. Has received a master's degree from an accredited school or college in			
2		counseling or other program that meets the academic and training standards			
3		adopted by the board;			
4		b. Has provided Provided personal and professional recommendations that meet the			
5		requirements adopted by the board and has satisfied the board that the applicant			
6		will adhere to the standards of the profession of counseling; and			
7		c. Has provided Provided a written plan for supervised experience which meets the			
8		requirements adopted by the board.			
9	4.	The board may waive the formal examination requirements for a professional			
10		counselor license whenif the applicant has been licensed or certified to practice			
11		counseling in another state under standards and qualifications similar to or greater			
12		than those set by the board.			
13	5.	A professional counselor shall renew the license every two years. The board shall			
14		renew a license upon payment of a fee set by the board and upon demonstration by			
15		the licenseholder of completion of continuing education requirements set by the board.			
16	6.	An associate professional counselor initially licensed under this chapter may be			
17		licensed for no more than two years. The associate professional counselor's license			
18		may not be extended beyond two years only, except upon recommendation of the			
19		associate professional counselor's supervisor and three other counselors, at least one			
20		of whom must be a professor from the associate professional counselor's training			
21		program.			
22	2 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 43-53-01 of the North Dakota Century				
23	Code is a	amended and reenacted as follows:			
24	7.	"Qualified supervision" means the supervision of clinical services, in accordance with			
25		standards established by the board, by an individual who has been recognized by the			
26		board as an approved supervisor. At least fifty percent of the hours of qualified			
27		supervision must be with an approved supervisor who is a licensed marriage and			
28		family therapist and additional hours of qualified supervision may be with other			
29		professionals designated by the approved supervisor and competent in the area of			
30		practice being supervised.			

1 SECTION 5. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL BOARDS - REPORT TO

- 2 **LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.** During the 2017-18 interim, the North Dakota board of social
- 3 work examiners, board of addiction counseling examiners, board of counselor examiners, and
- 4 North Dakota marriage and family therapy licensure board shall report to the legislative
- 5 management on the status of implementation of supervision and training requirements provided
- 6 in this Act.
