- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact subsections 4 and 5 to section 54-61-02 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to access to confidential records by the commission on legal
- 3 counsel for indigents.

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## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. Subsection 4 to section 54-61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 6 and enacted as follows: 7 Notwithstanding any provision of state law making the records confidential, but subject 8 to any prohibitions in federal law, in addition to or in lieu of a subpoena, in determining 9 eligibility for public defender services the commission may obtain access, including 10 automated access in the case of records maintained in automated databases, relevant 11 to making an eligibility determination for indigent defense services, to: 12 All records of other state and local government agencies relevant to 13 determination of eligibility for indigent defense services, including: 14

- (1) Vital statistics, including records of marriage, birth, and divorce;
- <u>(2)</u> Local tax and revenue records, including information on residence address, employer, income, and assets:
- Records concerning real and titled personal property; (3)

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- Records of occupational and professional licenses and records concerning <u>(4)</u> the ownership and control of corporations, partnerships, and other business entities;
- <u>(5)</u> Employment security records:
- Workforce safety and insurance records pursuant to a release signed by an (6)individual identifying the last-known address of the individual, wage-loss benefits, permanent partial impairment benefits, death benefits, or additional

1		benefits that individual has received or is entitled to receive from the
2		organization, and whether and where that individual is employed or as
3		otherwise provided in section 65-05-32;
4	<u>(7)</u>	Records of all agencies administering public assistance programs;
5	<u>(8)</u>	Records of the department of transportation, which access is not subject to
6		the requirements in section 39-16-03;
7	<u>(9)</u>	Corrections records;
8	(10)	Law enforcement records; and
9	<u>(11)</u>	Subject to an agreement with the state tax commissioner, state tax and
10		revenue records, including information on residence address, employer,
11		income, and assets; and
12	<u>b.</u> <u>Cer</u>	tain information contained in records held by private entities, subject to
13	safeguards on privacy and information security, consisting of:	
14	(1)	The name, address, social security number, and other requested relevant
15		income or asset information of the individual and the name and address of
16		the employer of the individual, as appearing in customer records of public
17		utilities, including cellular and wireless telephone service providers and
18		cable television companies, pursuant to an administrative subpoena if
19		requested; and
20	<u>(2)</u>	Information on assets and liabilities of the individual held by financial
21		<u>institutions.</u>
