- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to access to confidential records by the commission on legal
- 3 counsel for indigents.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. Subsection 4 to section 54-61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 6 and enacted as follows: 7 Notwithstanding any provision of state law making the records confidential, but subject 8 to any prohibitions in federal law, in addition to or in lieu of a subpoena, in determining 9 eligibility for public defender services the commission may obtain access, including 10 automated access in the case of records maintained in automated databases, to: 11 All records of other state and local government agencies, including: 12 Vital statistics, including records of marriage, birth, and divorce; <u>(1)</u> 13 Local tax and revenue records, including information on residence address, (2) 14 employer, income, and assets; 15 Records concerning real and titled personal property; <u>(3)</u> 16 Records of occupational and professional licenses and records concerning (4) 17 the ownership and control of corporations, partnerships, and other business 18 entities; 19 (5)**Employment security records**; 20 <u>(6)</u> Records of all agencies administering public assistance programs; 21 Records of the department of transportation, which access is not subject to <u>(7)</u> 22 the requirements in section 39-16-03; 23 Corrections records; (8) 24 (9) Law enforcement records; and

2			revenue records, including information on residence address, employer,
3			income, and assets; and

14	SECTION 2. Subsection 5 to section 54-61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
15	and enacted as follows:

17		<u>under s</u>	subsection 4, the denial must include a statement of the legal authority for the
18		<u>denial.</u>
